(rounded to $2\frac{1}{2}$ sgr.) internal GAPU fee, the internal pamphlet fee being $\frac{1}{3}$ sgr, per loth. In addition the "foreign" fee for a pamphlet was $\frac{1}{2}$ sgr. per 2 loth; so 2 sgr. "foreign" fee also was marked in red crayon on the front. This paid all fees to destination. It was sent first to Bremen, but the steamer had left and it was redirected to Hamburg for the next German steamer. Scarce wrapper to the United States from Germany.
