In the summer of 1779 he com-
manded an expedition against the
tribe of Iroquois Indians at New-
(now Elmira) and with about
men defeated them.

Franklin Delano Roosevelt autograph; Horseheads machine cancel and Klotzbach cachet.
Roosevelt, a stamp collector, was governor of New York when the Sullivan stamp was
issued, and became President of the United States in 1933. While the stamp and cachet on
this cover have faded, the autograph and cancel seem unaffected by the elements.

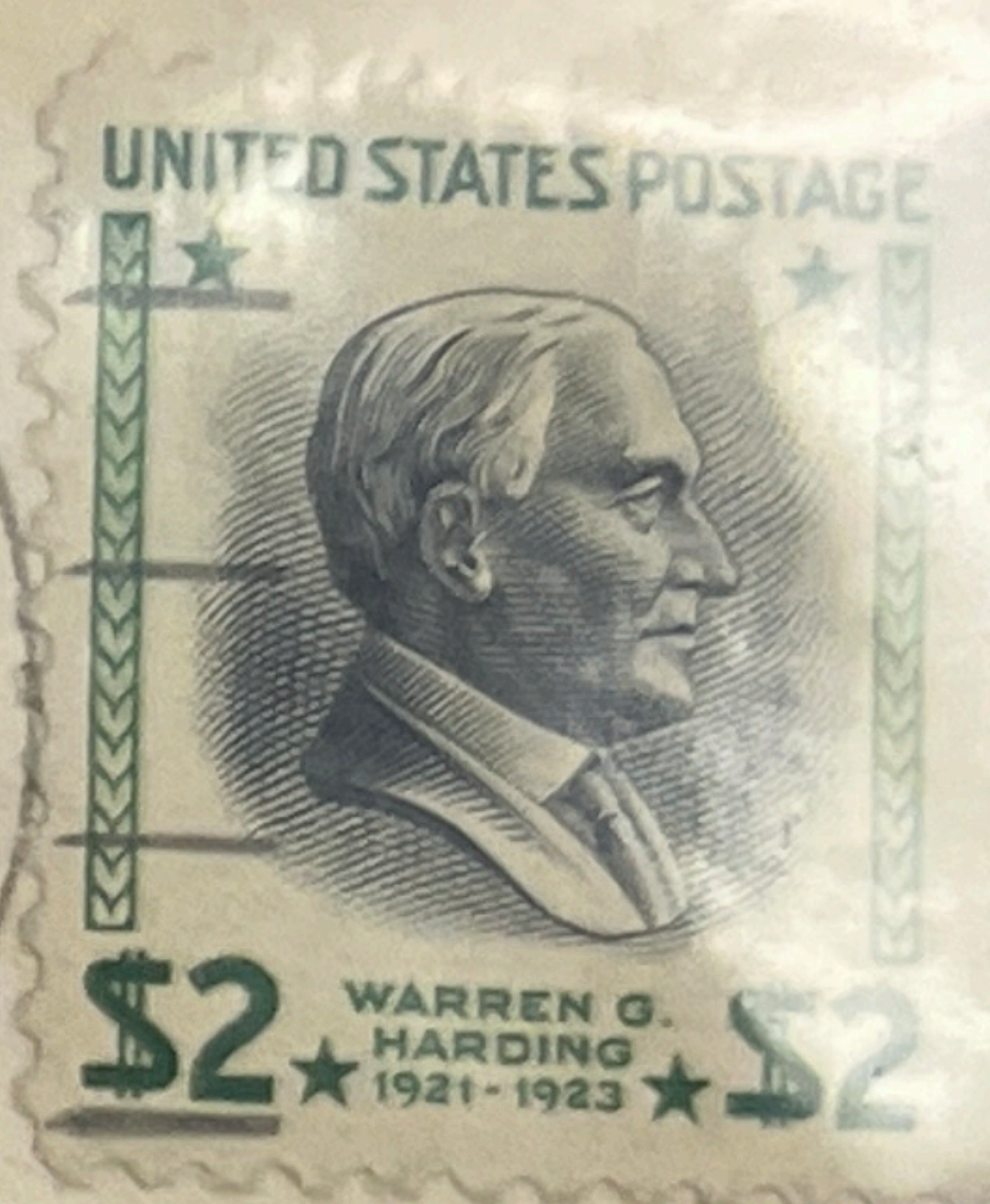
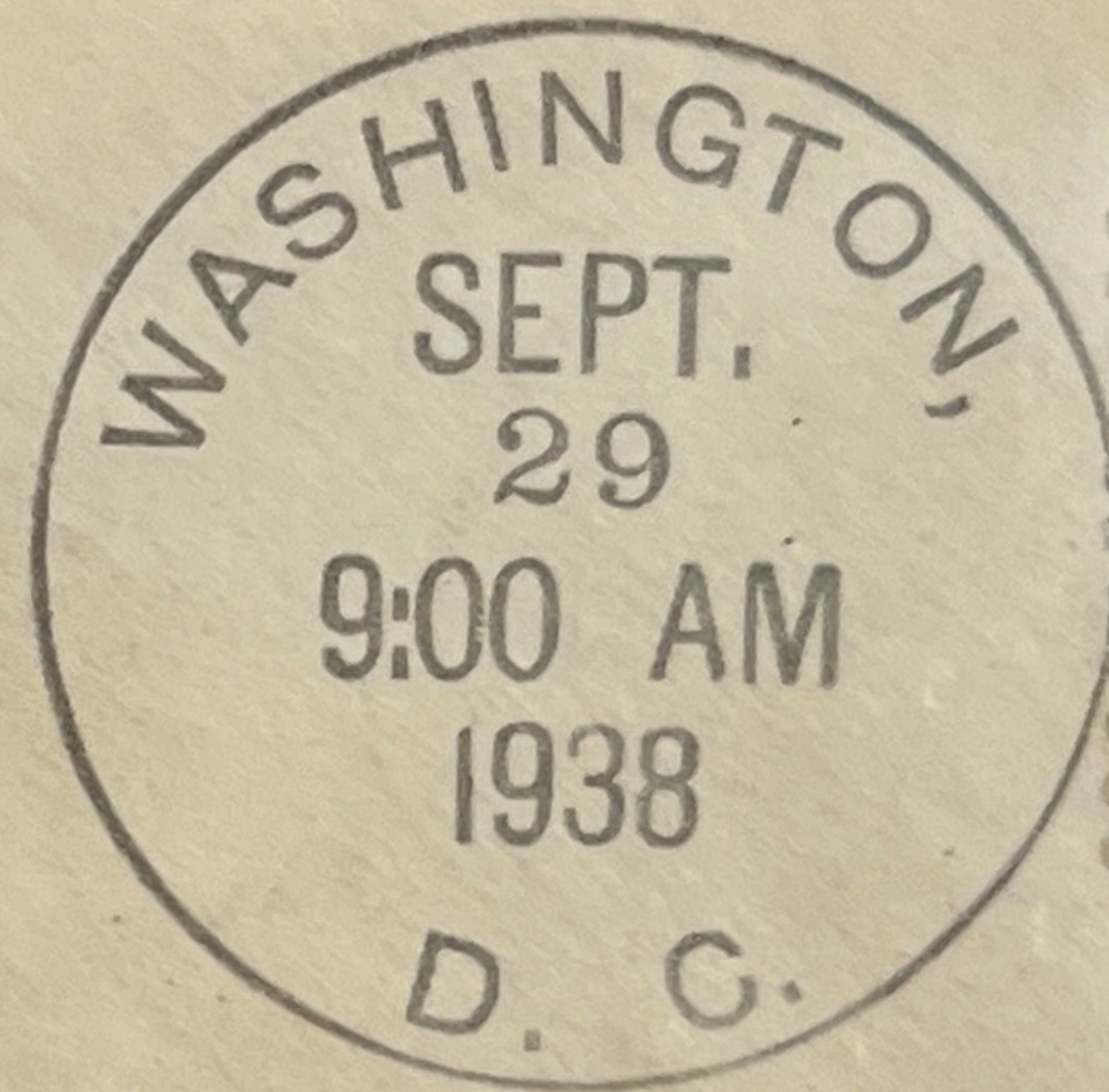
THE POSTAGE STAMPS OF THE UNITED STATES HAVE, FROM TIME TO TIME, PORTRAYED MEN WHO HAVE SERVED THEIR COUNTRY AS PRESIDENT... TO THE YEAR 1938, HOWEVER, NOT ALL PRESIDENTS HAD BEEN SO HONORED... ILLUSTRIOUS STATESMEN, MILITARY HEROES AND OTHERS HAD BEEN CONSIDERED SUBJECTS OF GREATER MERIT THAN THOSE WHO, SERVING IN TIME OF PEACE, WERE NOT AFFORDED LIKE OPPORTUNITIES FOR SPECTACULAR SERVICE OR OUTSTANDING ACCOMPLISHMENT

THE STAMP AFFIXED HERETO IS ONE OF A SERIES ISSUED DURING 1938 AND 1939 FOR GENERAL POSTAL USE... ORIGINAL PLANS CALLED FOR THE PORTRAYAL OF ALL DECEASED PRESIDENTS FROM WASHINGTON TO COOLIDGE

FRANKLIN, THE "FATHER OF THE U.S. POSTAL SYSTEM" AND MARTHA WASHINGTON, THE FIRST "FIRST LADY" OF THE NATION ARE ALSO HONORED BY THIS ISSUE.
