




Paris marked letter required two rates (manuscript, upper left corner) and 16 decimes postage due.



Uncommon private route marking.

Launched Aug. 20, 1853 for Australasian Pacific Mail SP Co. 1854 Kangaroo (Inman) chartered to British Gov't. July 30, 1856 first voyage Liverpool-Philadelphia. Feb. 11, 1857 first voyage Liverpool-N.Y. 1870 Kangaroo as British cable steamer. 1880 Selamet (Turkish). 1901 (approx.) scrapped.



Paris marked letter required two rates (manuscript, upper left corner) and 16 decimes postage due. Uncommon private route marking.

Black handstamp in upper left corner was a private routing mark of W. Schall & Co., New York, whose company marking is on the reverse. Handstamps for several different steamships were used by this company to indicate desired vessels to carry their letters. Paris marked 8 decimes postage due. Uncommon private route marking.
