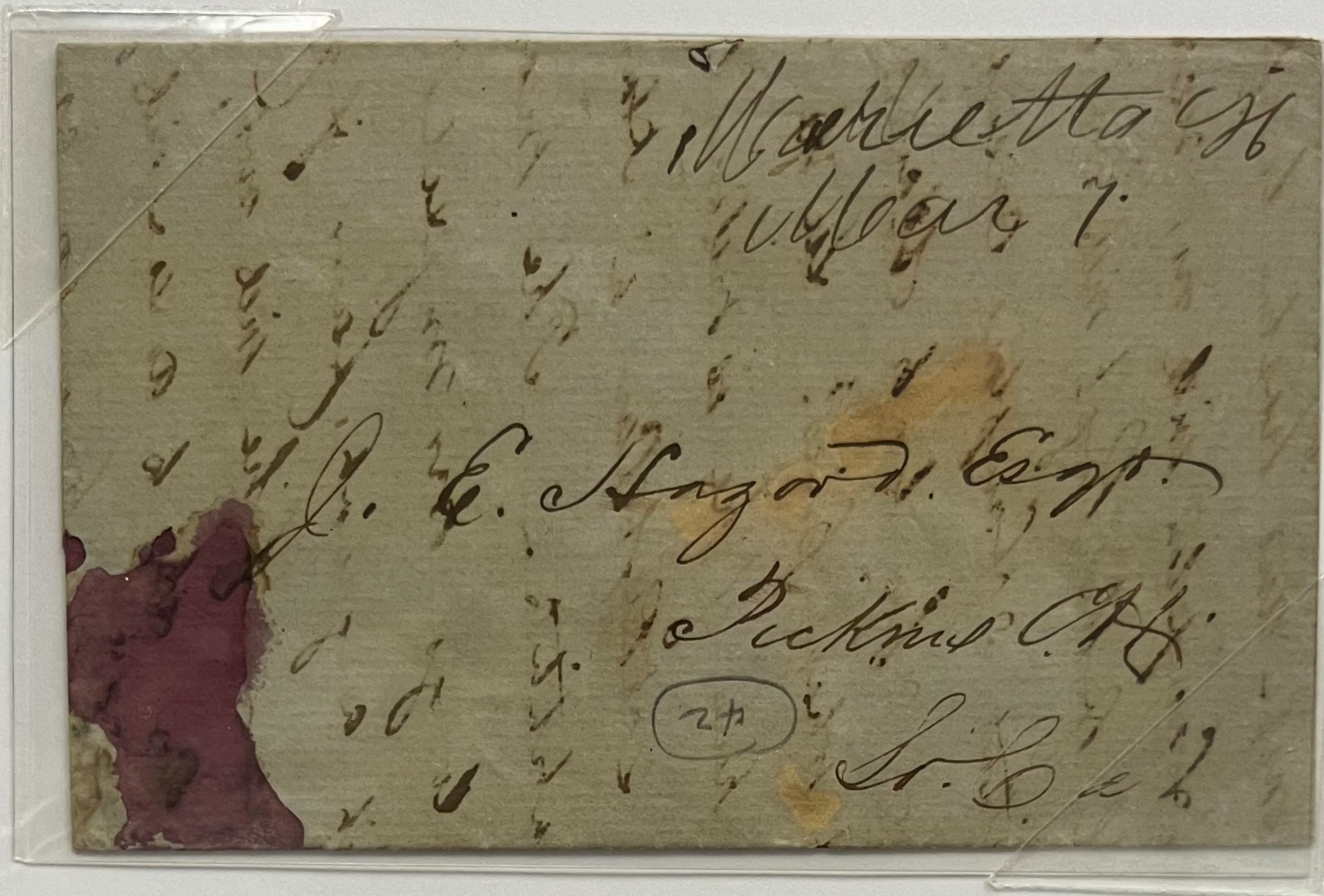

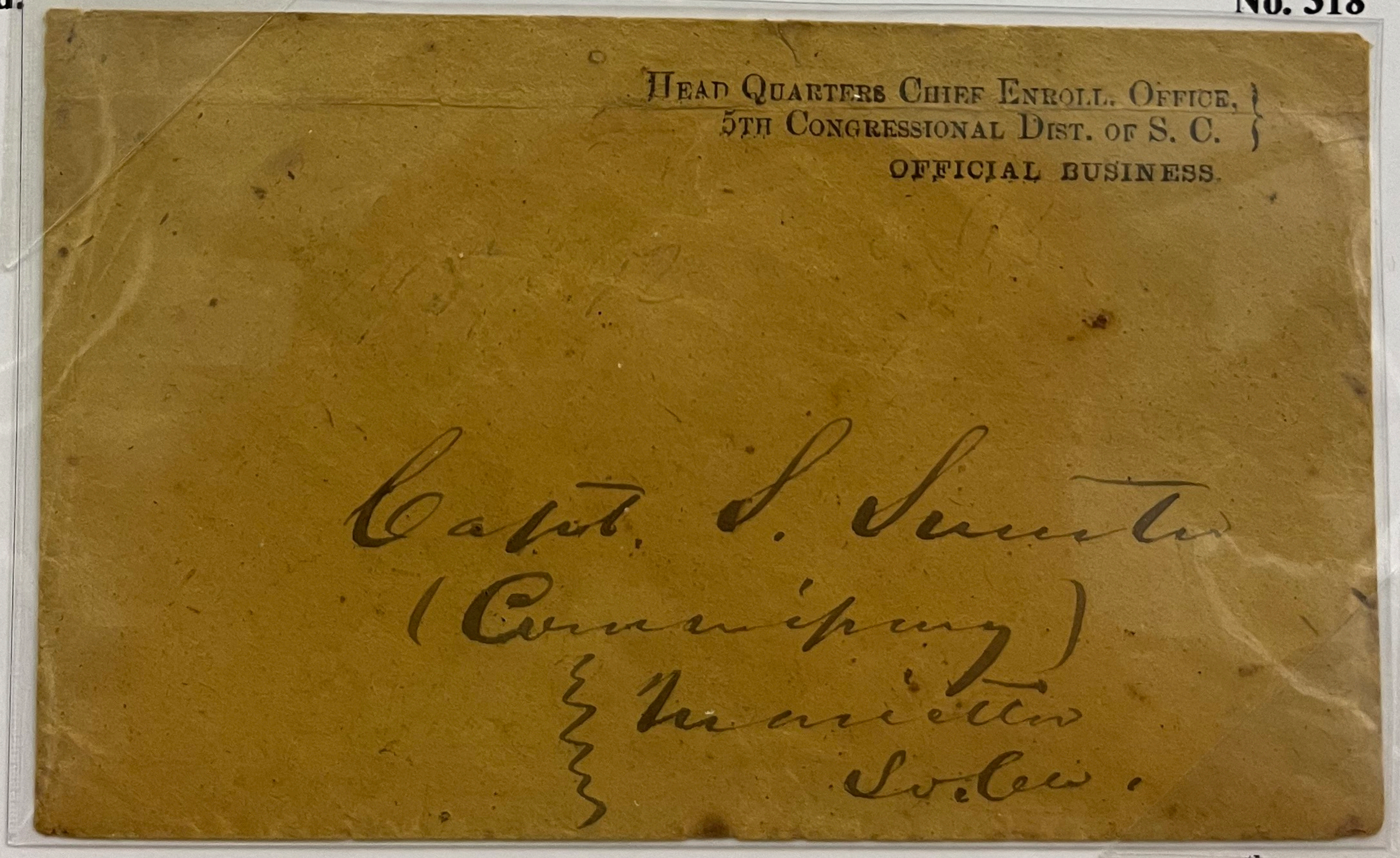

**Dear Sir**

**I received by yesterday's mail your favor of the 1<sup>st</sup> inst. and hasten to reply. I find that General Hampton will not receive temporary substitutes and the Col. of the Reg't will not take the responsibility of doing so without Hamptons consent.**

Buttus, 2<sup>nd</sup> Regt Cav. in Hamptons brigade as a permanent substitute. The mother is bad and I am too unwell to go there myself to see him now but will later. Its a great favor if you will get him to come over to see me. If he will not, as soon as the mother settles, and I am able to do so, I will go over to see him. I am very much obliged to you for your kindness in attending to this for me so far, and will be under a greater obligation if you will see him again and ask him to come over, or will find out and let me know if he will go as a permanent substitute.**
