




Sept 11th 1864

Friend James Hagood

Sir, I am at home on sick Furlough an (and) I dont want to have to go to Columbia to stay any more. I shall feel myself much obliged to you if you will inform Co.(Commandant/Commissioner) Norton of my condition. Tell him that I first joined the 4 Reg't of SCV an (and) was exempt from field service by disability caused by an old hurt an (and) signed over to Capt. R. D. Senn as a provost guard by the Board of Doctors. at the time they asked me how old I was. I told them I could not tell. But would suppose that I was born about the date of 1820. My father says that I was born in 1818. He nows (knows) that by the date of a Land Deed where I was born. Any plan that the Co. will design I will pursue. I can mount myself and do the best I can. James, please attend to this as soon as you can an (and) write to me apon (upon) the whole and give me Relief if possible. Direct your letter to Pickensville. Please attend to this an (and) I will ever be obliged to you.
