I am quite tired tonight and will be obliged to rise at daylight tomorrow or I will have to content myself with sending you only an apology for a letter. Plz I do wish you were here Those been feeling so lonely Commission (sp) .

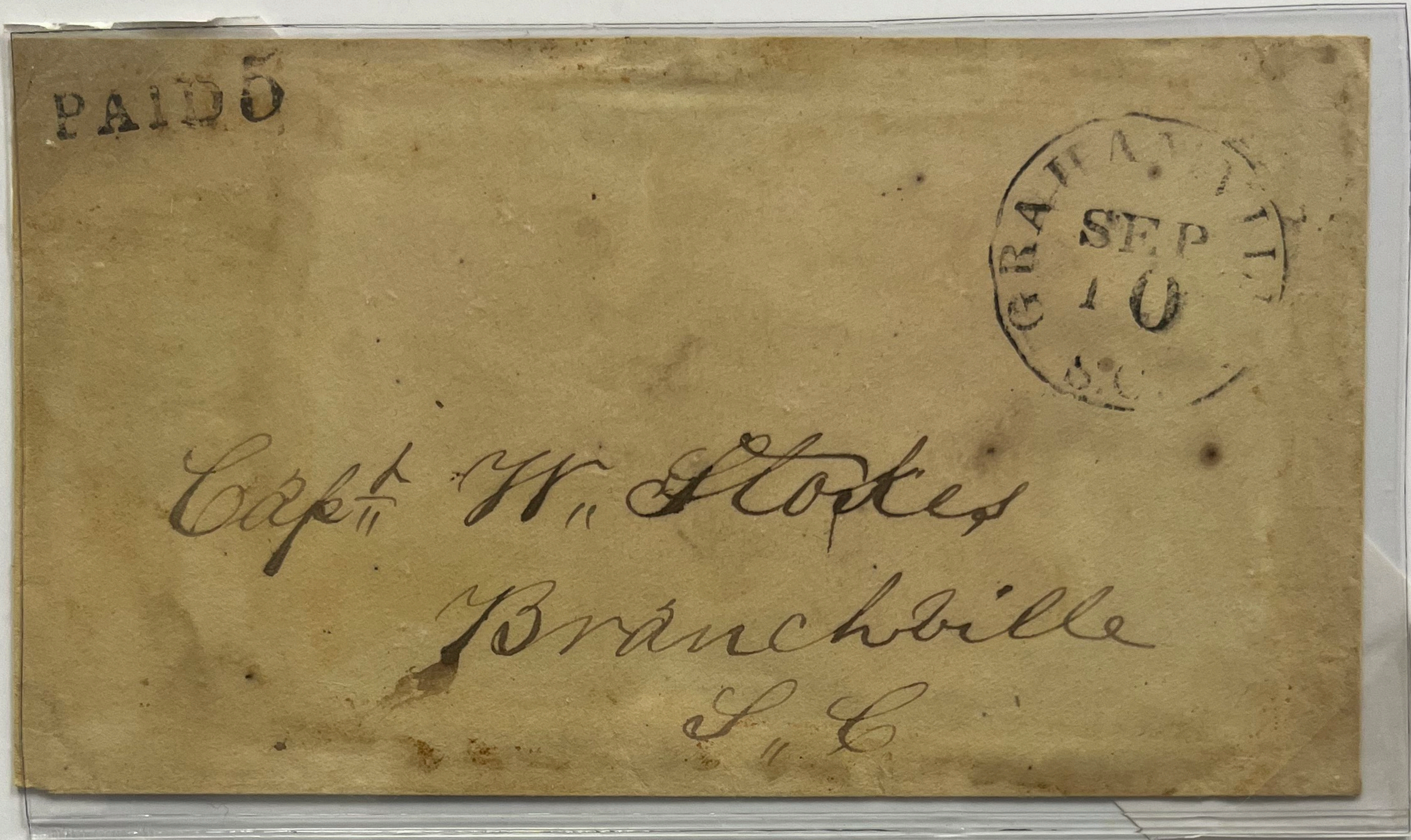

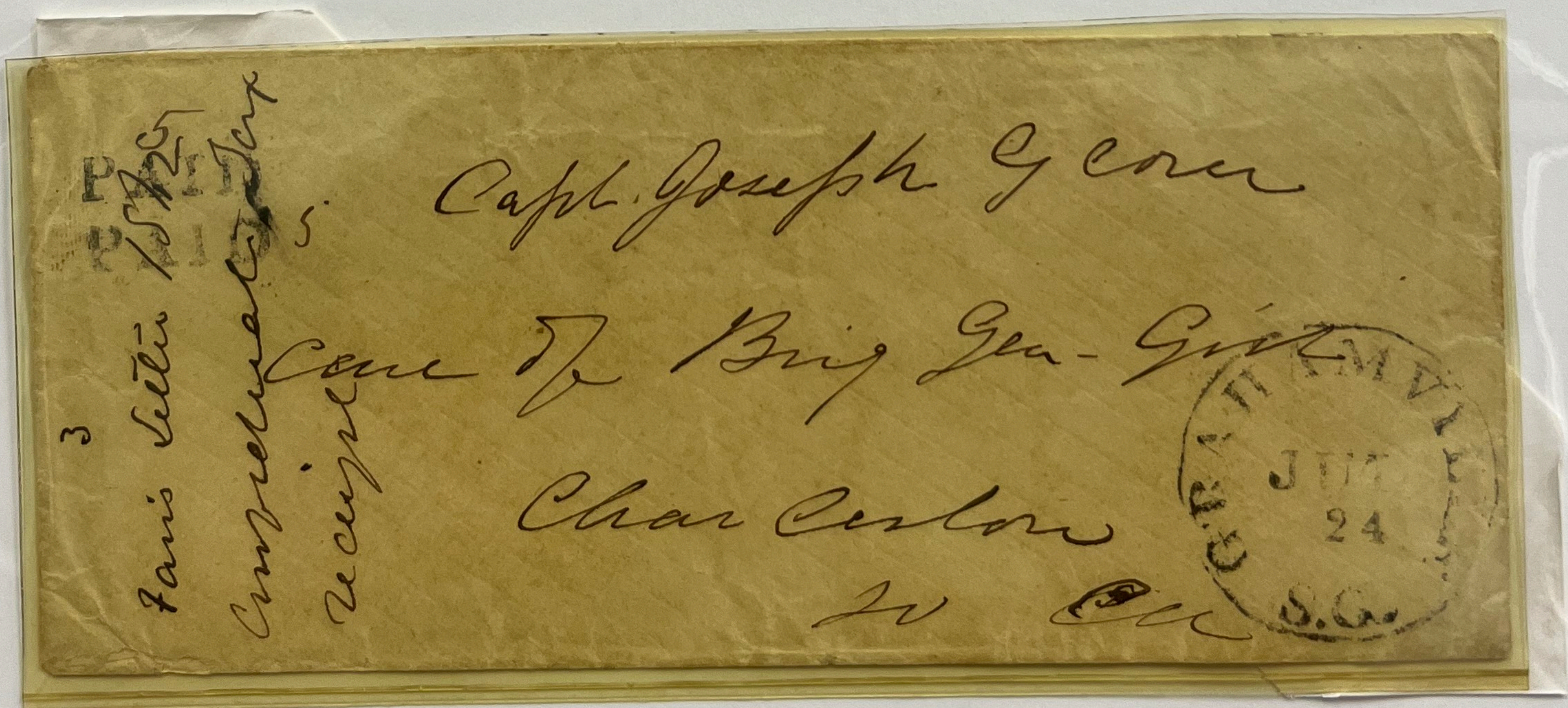

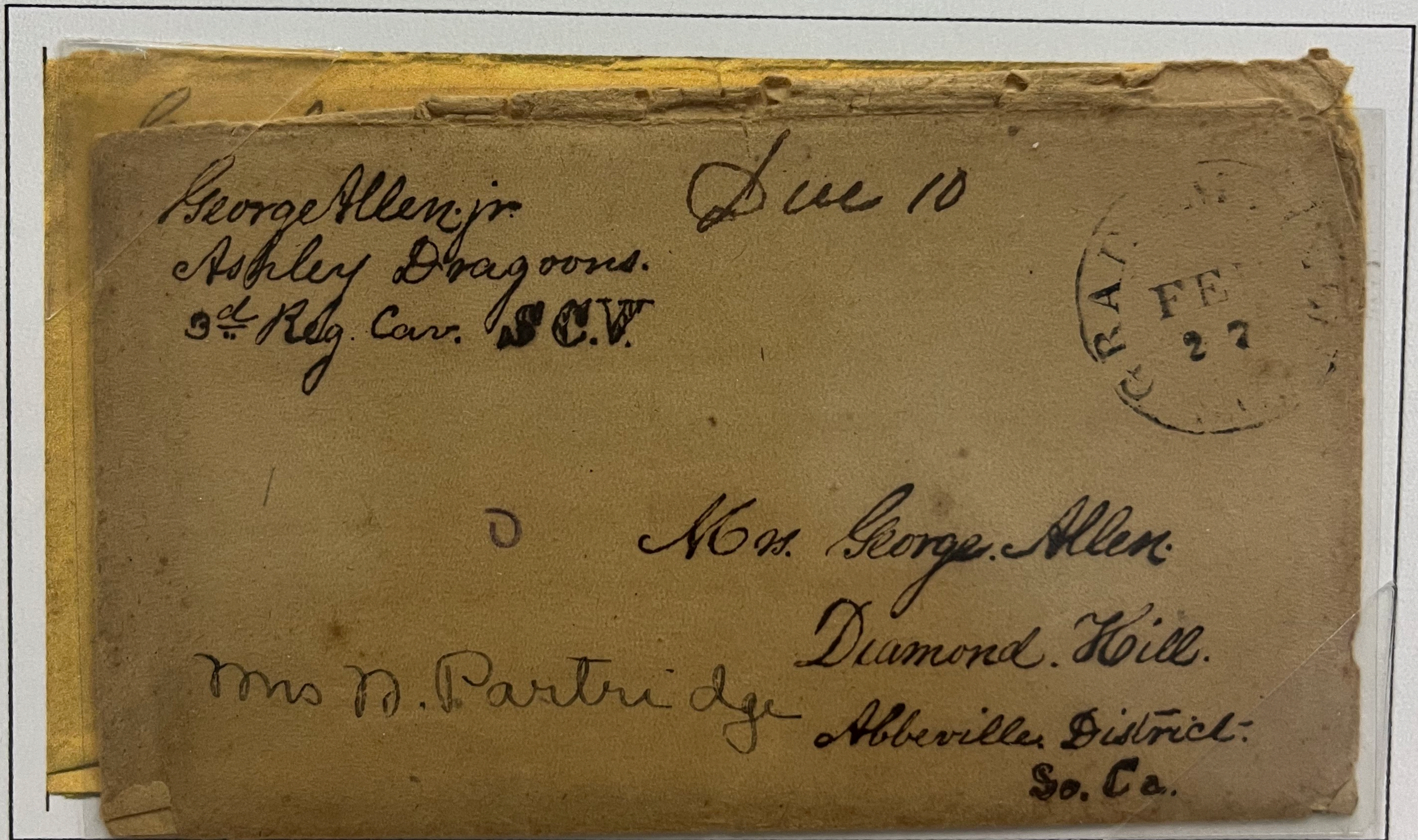

Private George Allen, Jr. enlisted January 10th 1863 in Co. H, 3rd SC Calvary at Grahamville, SC. He served through 1863 and 1864. There is no record for 1865.

Grahamville 26th Feb 1863

My dear Anna

I received your pleasant letter yesterday evening and do not feel right if I let it remain unanswered. We cannot tell when we will move from this post. Troops are come and are coming, Genl. Cook has command of us with the rest of the Brigade. A great change has taken place since my coming. When I first came the soldiers were in joyful spirits laughing and talking all day, playing games, having cock fights, horse racing etc. But lately every thing is sober and serious, not knowing when we may be called to action. The ears is attracted every day to the rumbling of the distant Yankee cannon even now I hear loud and steady firing in the direction of Savannah, rations are on hand to be immediately given out on a march and every thing in general indicates an early fight.

The Misses Addens are in Aiken and Cousin Ham is gone there also, only a very few poor families remain here now.

Uncle Gaston is at New River and I hear is going on planting with a few negroes. one of his negro men ran away from Georgia (where he was hired) and joined him at Newkwin.

Serjt Tom Hayward is very sick, he is Mr Savage's son. The weather is very good none of those never ending Alp Country rains torment us, I suppose your roads must be miserable indeed.

I wrote to Guinard yesterday I wish you would not write in Das' Abmon paper it cannot hold enough. but write on this kind of paper on both sides and it will satisfy me. Tell Maria I was on picket that stormy Saturday night you spoke of. Benjie is in Aiken on a detachment of 5 days. Uncle Geo is well and very kind to me. I am well satisfied with my mess. I get a plenty to eat viz beef & rice

and sleep delightfully. But if Pa was to come to see me and to his business, and tumble in with me he would wonder how I could sleep. But you see I am a soldier and dont expect feather beds, and roast-turkey, and the like. My horse has my undivided attention, he is very faithful and steady. I would not trade him off. He is not a pretty horse but I dont care for that. a good disposed gentle animal is what I want and I have him.

Tell old Dennis Howdy for me. Love to my sisters and brothers, can Anna Belle talk? Tell the girls they must not expect me to write to them now but must write to me as I value them very much. They can read of the letters I write to you and Papa, and always imagine that they have some claim on them. I hope you will get along well my dearest Mother, and everything prof. If I fall in the coming battle, I hope to be still yr son in Heaven. I feel that grace is filling my heart more & more each day, which I pray for daily. We have no divine service now. Goodbye my mother. Ur aff. son George Allen

I will add something for papa.

My dear Papa,

I will write to Hardenville this evening to Capt Trout and will let you know or send his answer.

It is impossible for me to leave, as we go to bed expecting to be alarmed during our slumber. I wish you could come down, it wont be much expense and I assure you you will get satisfaction. Ur aff. son wants a horse about 14

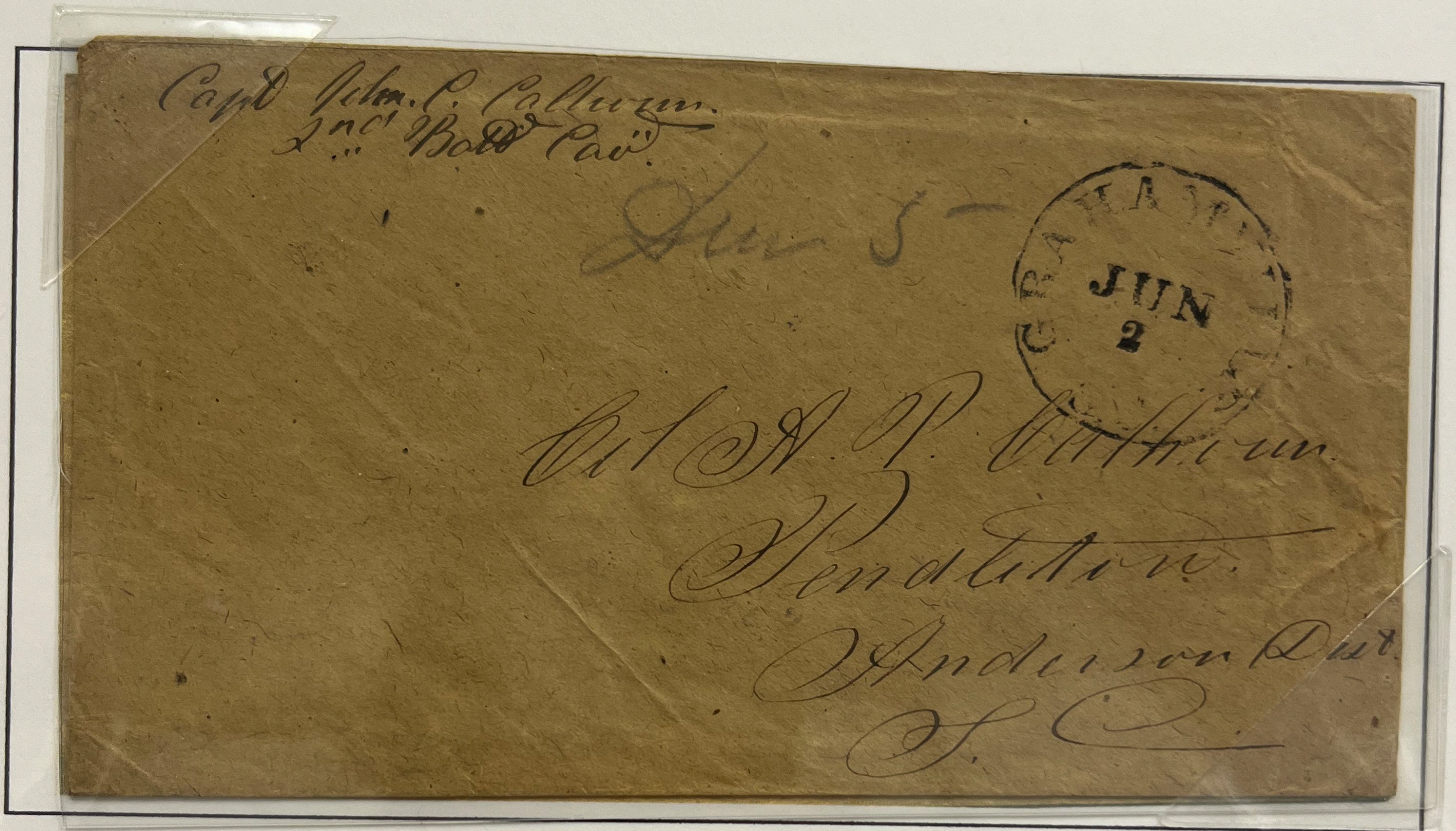
hands high not over eight and a well made, active and gentle. he says give not over \$400.00 for him, or her, and he will send Lot to bring him round by land.

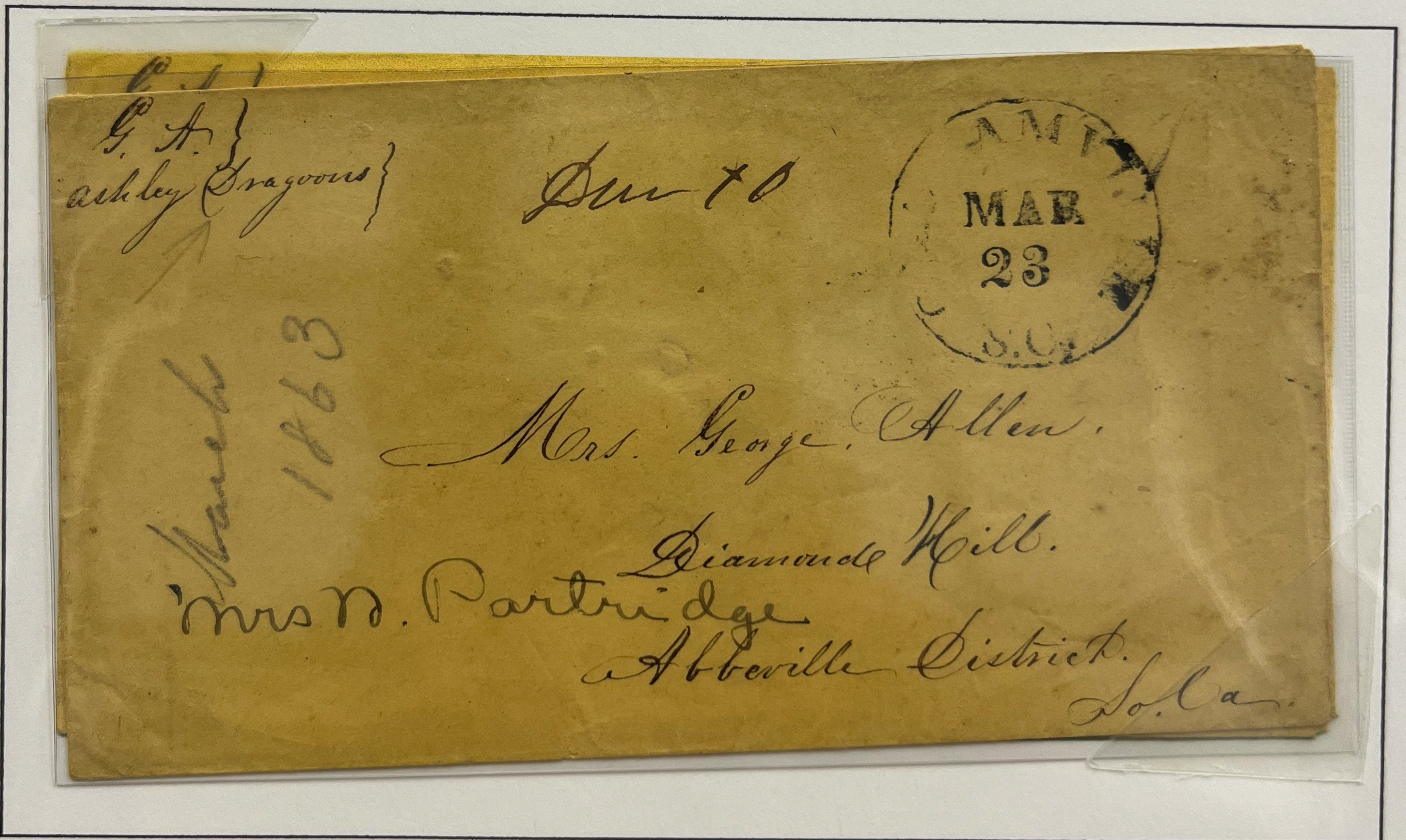

Captain John C. Calhoun enlisted on May 6 1861 (by the Executive of SC), in
Pickens District. His Battalion was consolidated into the 4th Rutledge Rifles in May
1862. In May 1862 he reenlisted for the duration of the war as Captain Co. C. He
served throughout the war but was sickly for most of 1864 and returned to duty
Nov. 24, 1864. He was listed as a deserter on Feb. 14, 1864 but was sick and sent to
the General Hospital in Richmond and the hospital in Huguenot Springs, Va.

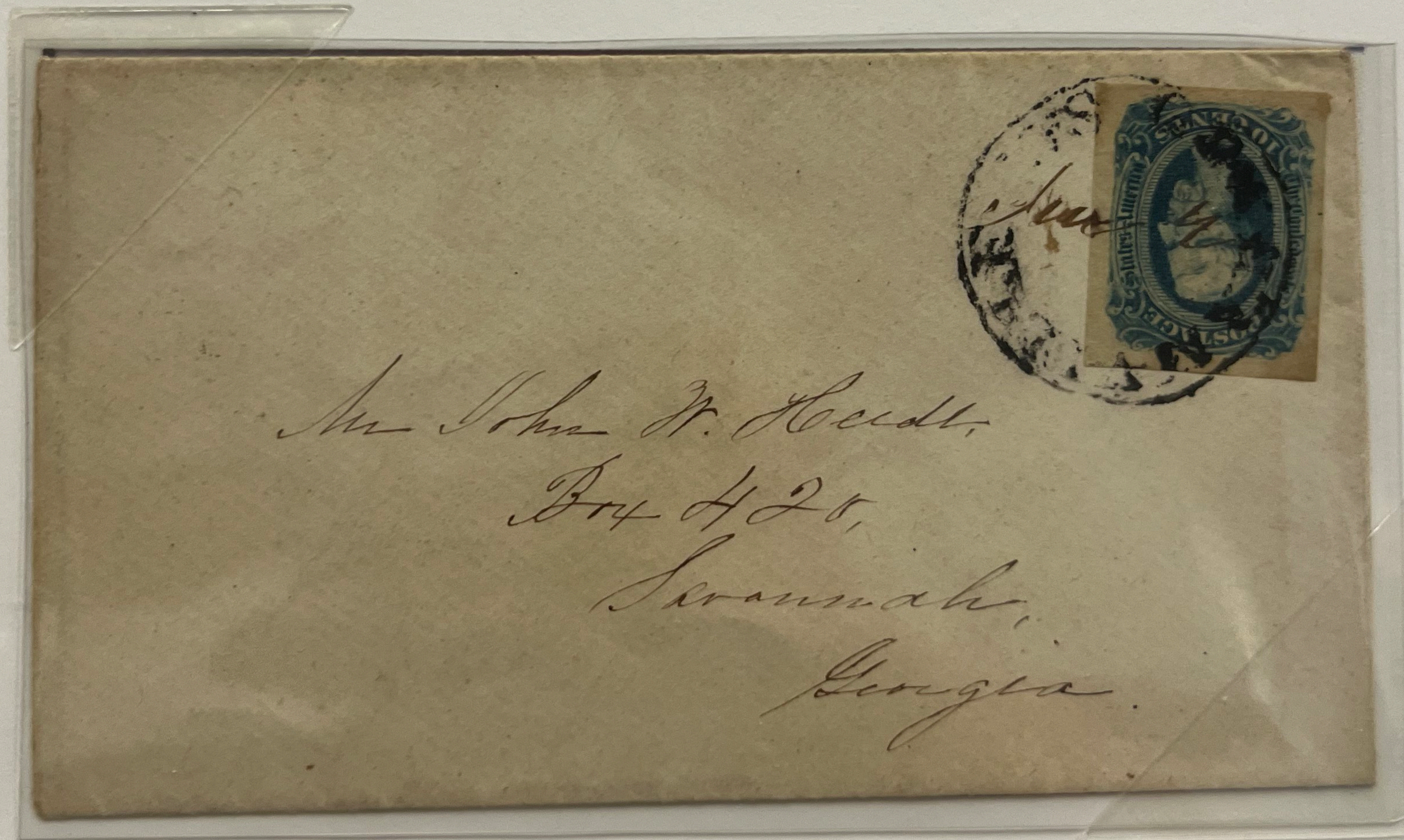

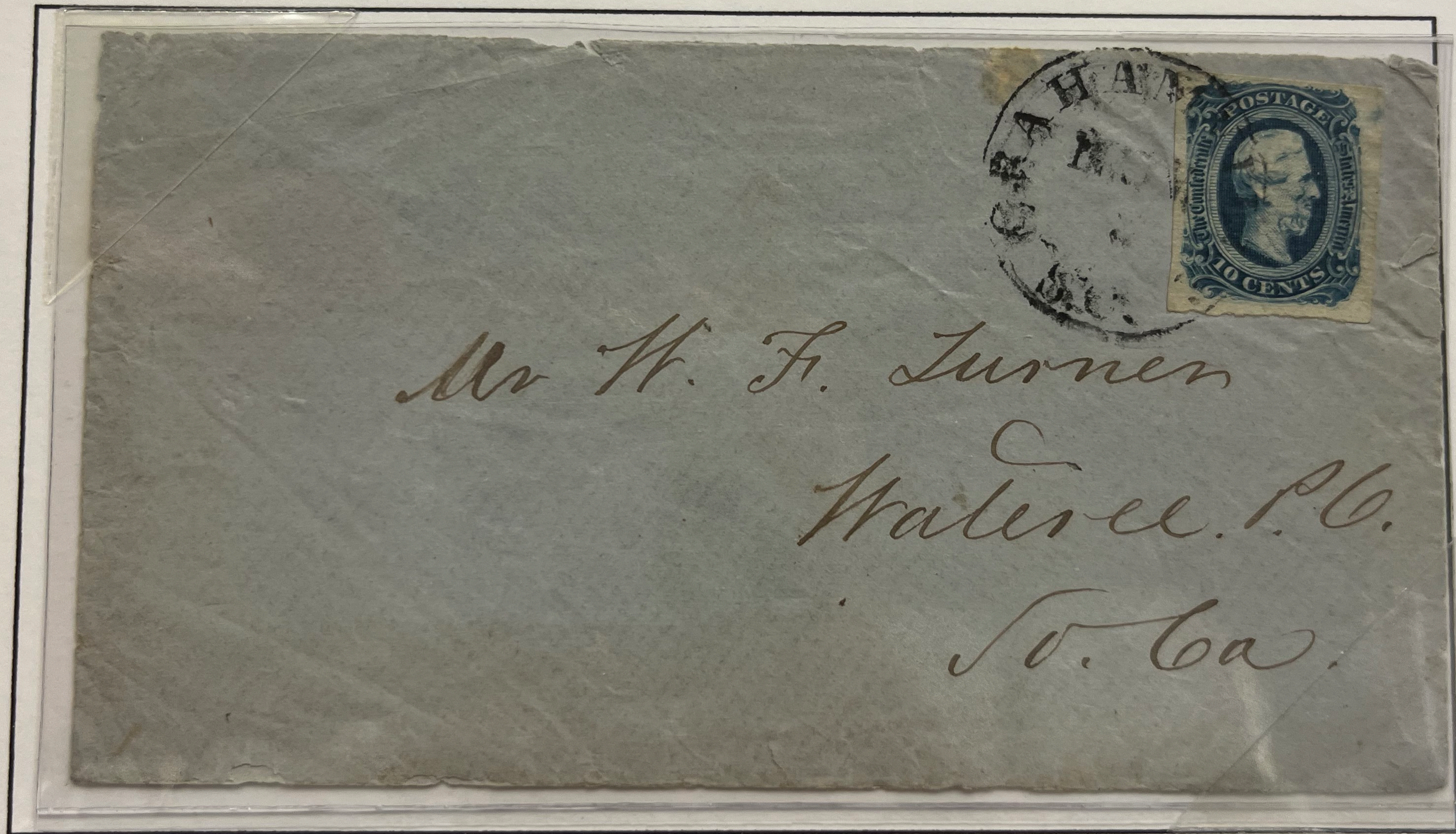
