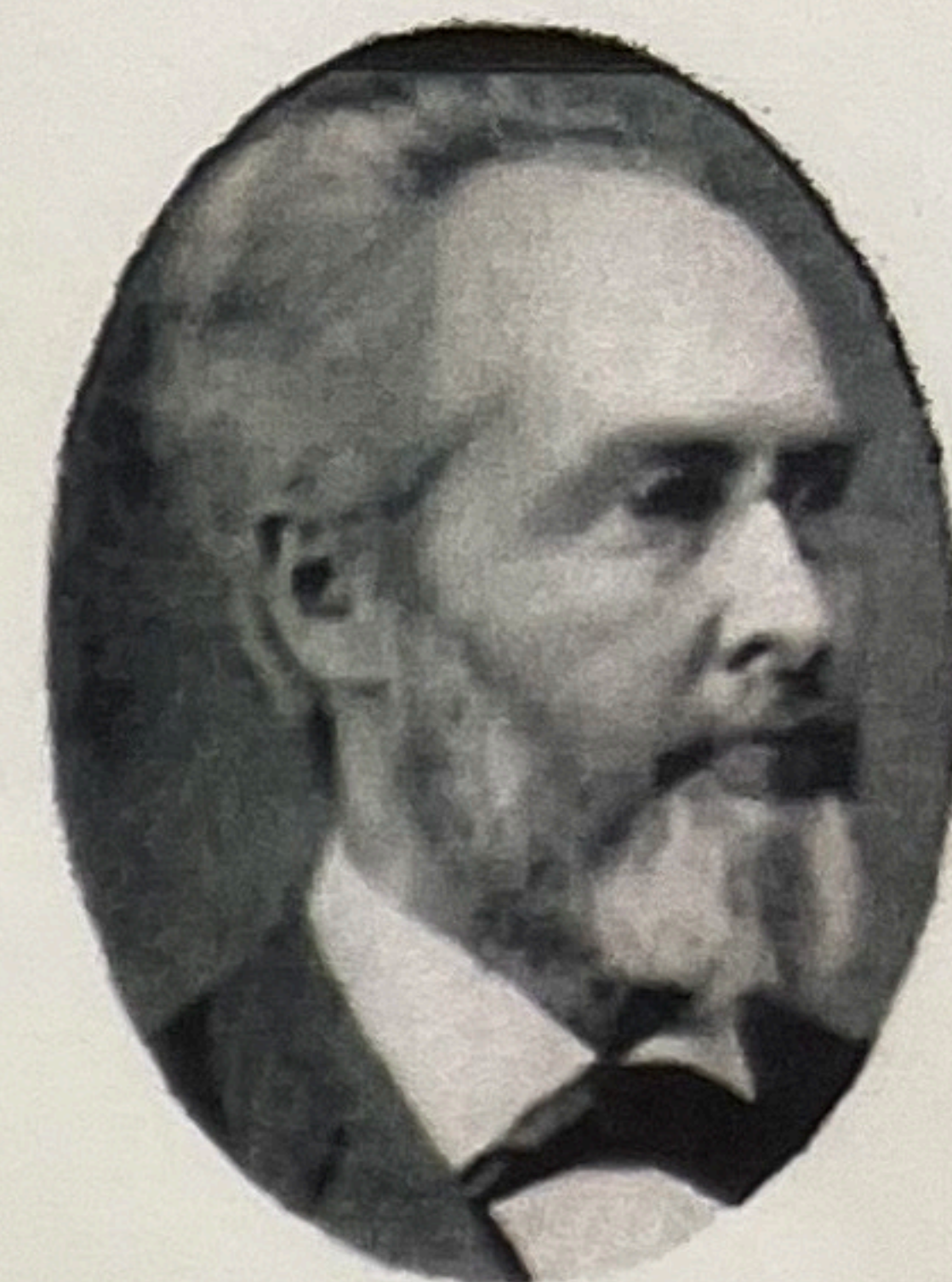




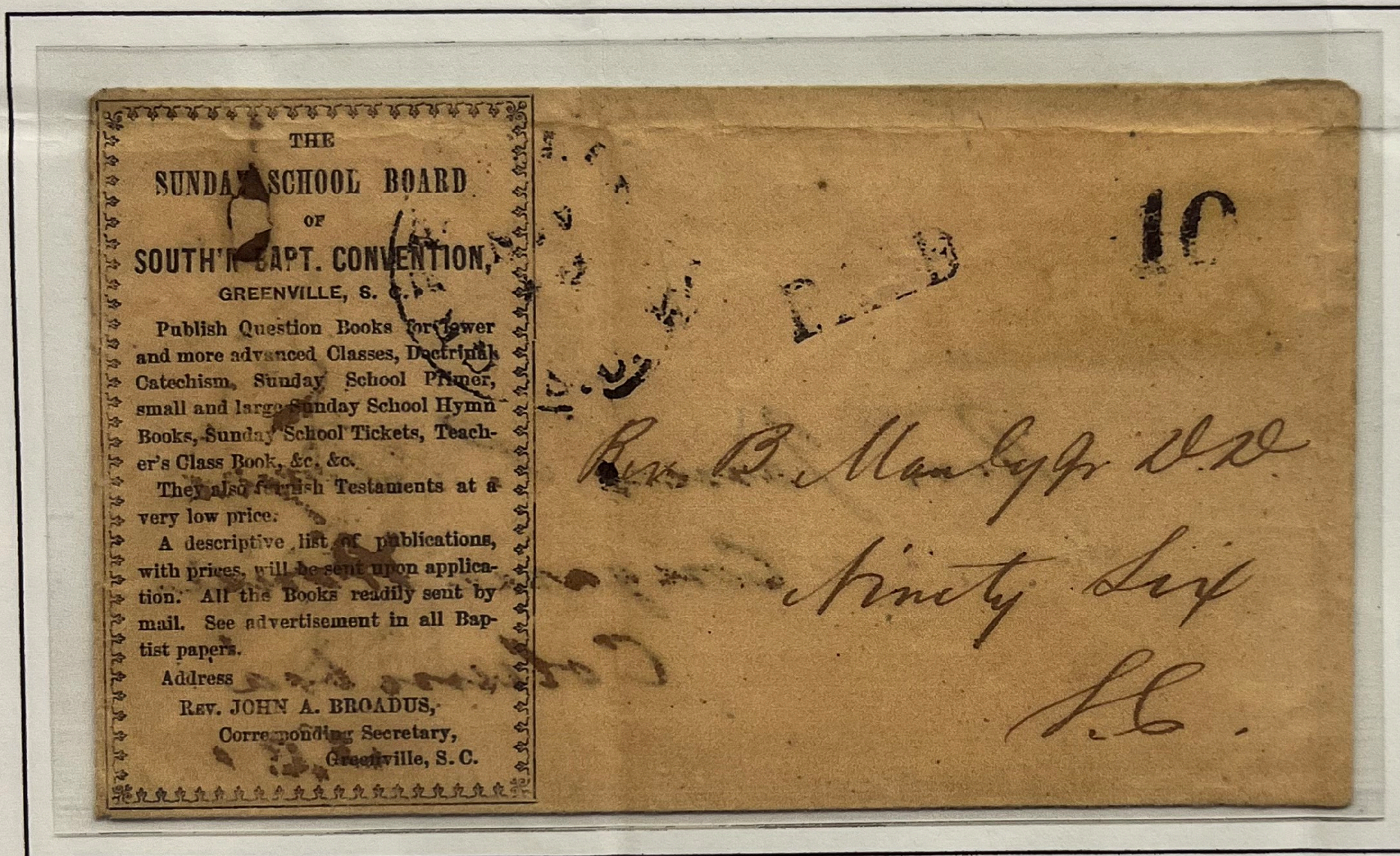
Minister - Professor / Denominational Leader

Basil Manly, Jr. was born at Charleston, S.C., where his father was pastor of First Baptist Church. After graduating from Princeton Theological Seminary, Basil accepted the pastorate of First Baptist Church, Richmond, Va. and then became President of Richmond Female Institute in 1854. Manly moved to Greenville S.C. to be a professor at the newly founded Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Under his leadership, the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention was established in 1863. He was the President and Dr. John A. Broadus was Secretary.

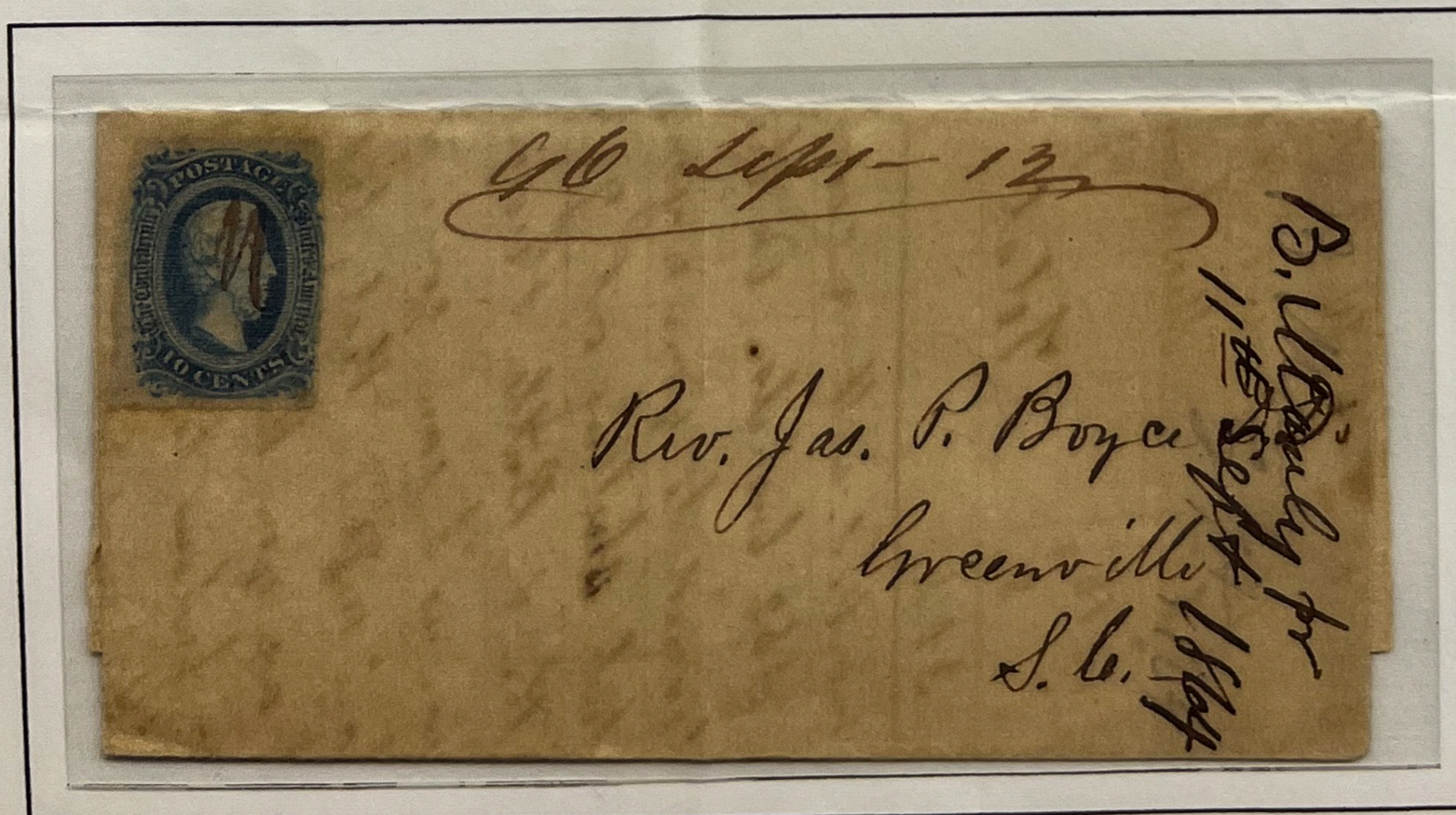

Turned cover – 1st usage (above) Handstamp “PAID” and “10”, Dietz Type IB, with a GREENVILLE C. H. SC CDS dated Nov 19. (1864). Addressed to Rev. B (Basil) Manly Jr. DD, NINETY SIX S.C. Advertising Cover with the entire left side a boxed printed card for the Sunday School Board of South’n Baptist Convention Greenville SC, advertising printed religious books. Second usage (below) has a pair of #7s, with deep blue color and pencil canceled, without townmark, and addressed to Rev. James P. Boyce, Congaree House, COLUMBIA SC, with docketing 11 Dec 1864. Very scarce advertising cover, not at all commonly seen as a turned cover.
