**Reverse docket indicates enclosure date of March 17, 1864 (not included). Letter probably from a CSA P.O.W. in a Union Prison. Originally addressed to go through Union Mails, in an outer envelope, then apparently carried by a paroled P.O.W. into the Southern mail.**

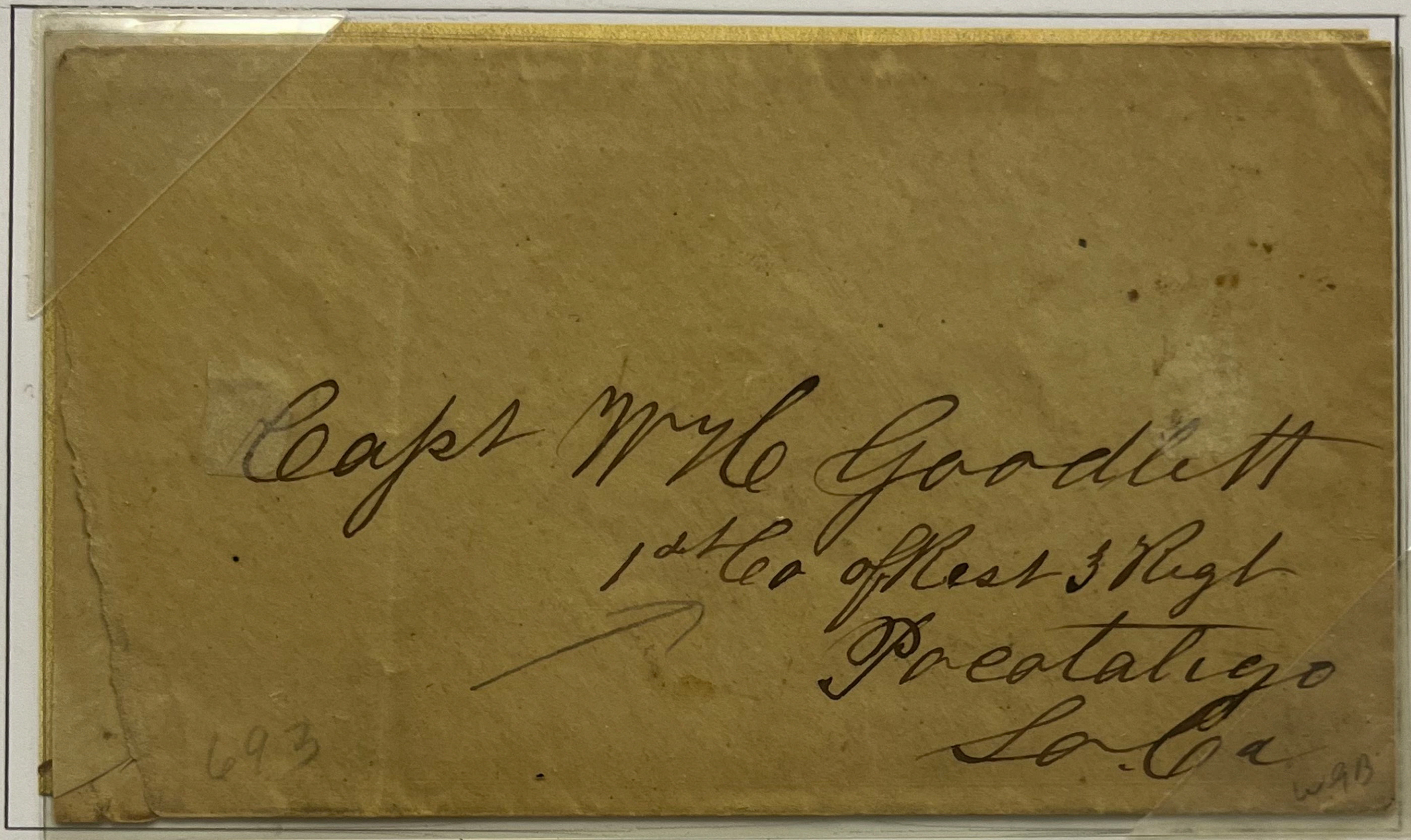

Wm. H. Goodlett joined Company F. 3<sup>rd</sup> Reg't, 1<sup>st</sup> SC Reserves as a Capt. on Nov.  
13, 1862 for a 90 day duration. He reenlisted in Sept. 1863 for 6 months as a Private  
in Co. H, 1<sup>st</sup> SC State Troops. In Dec 1863 he was listed as AWOL.

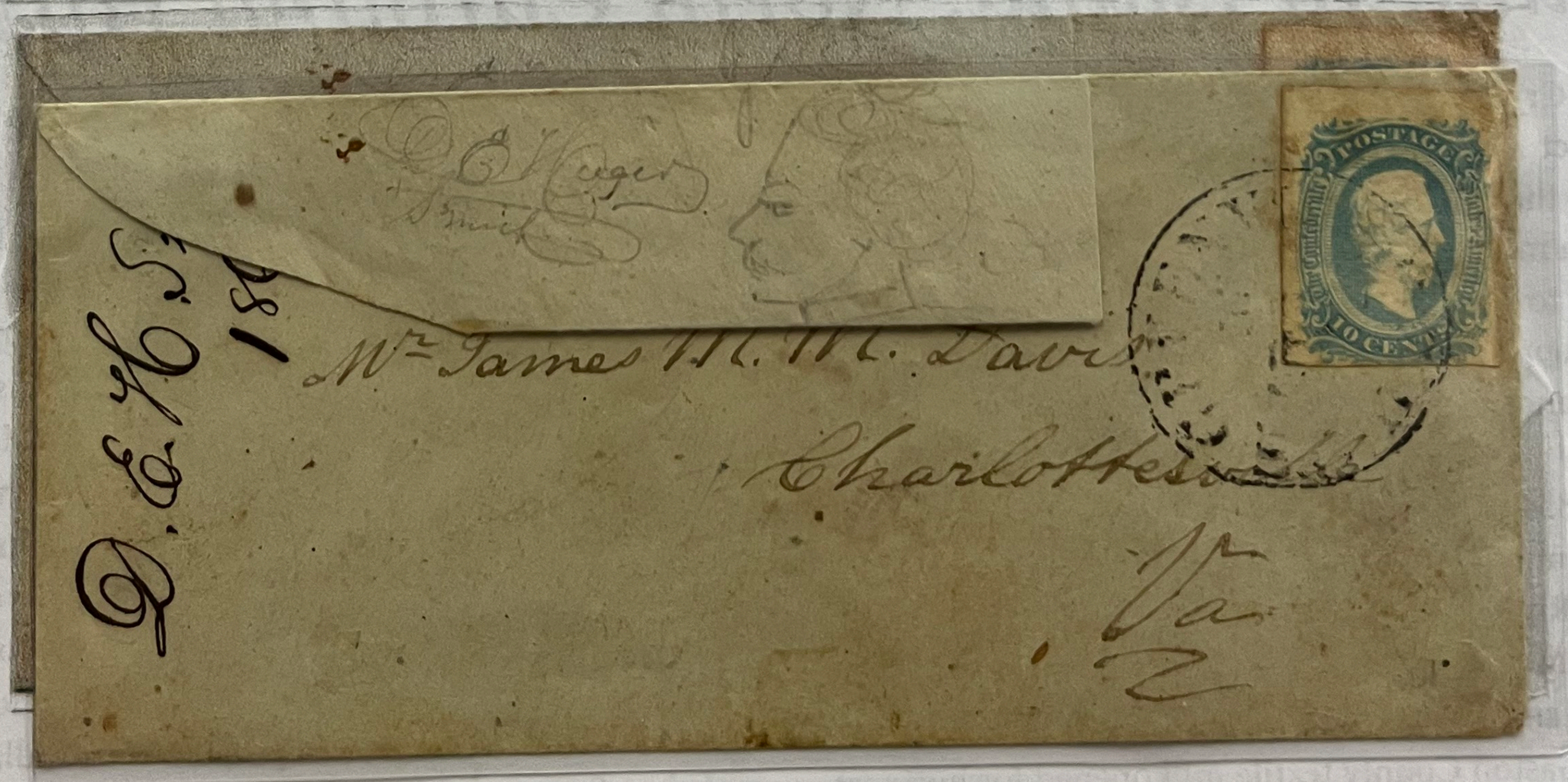

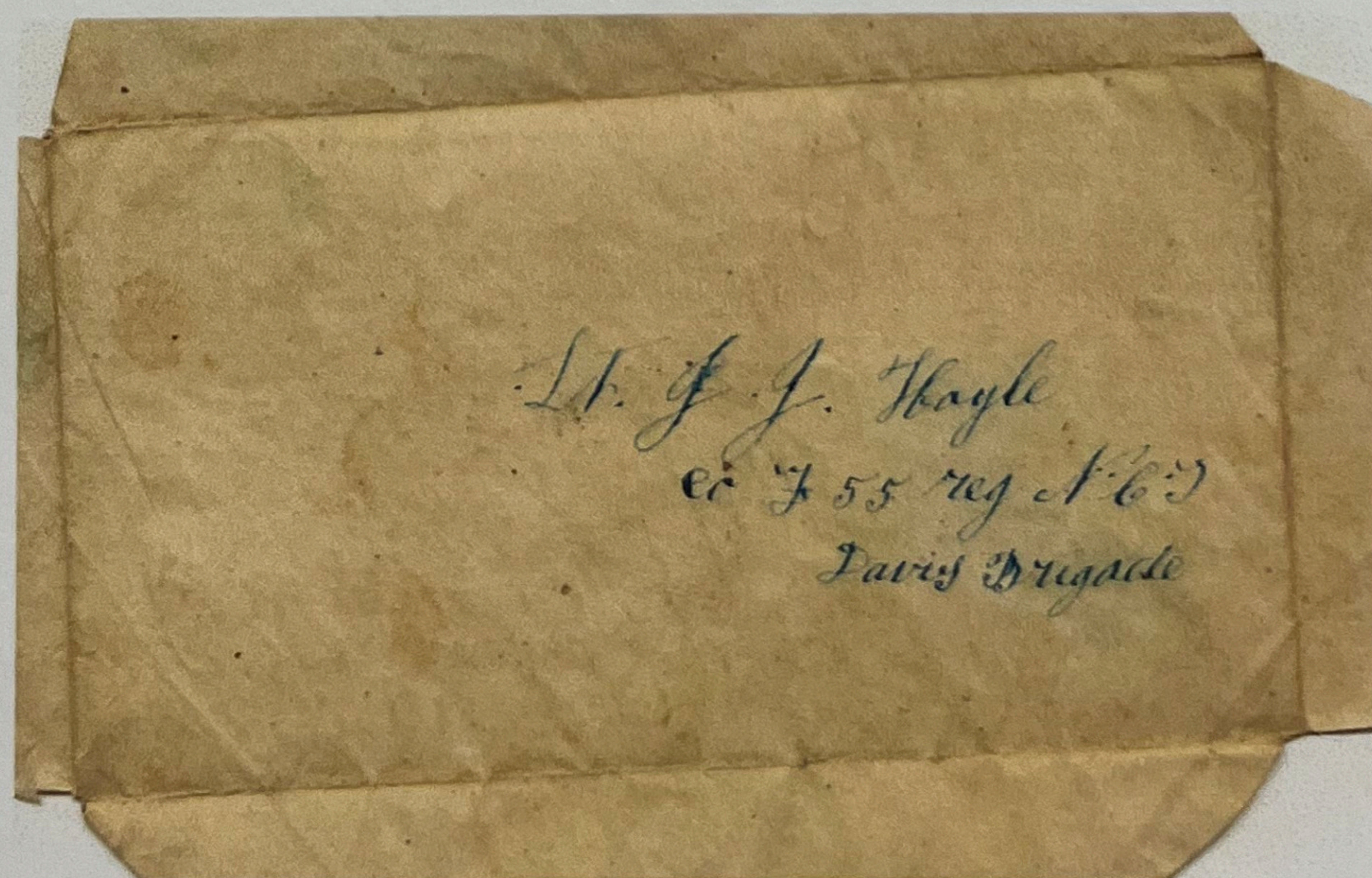

Joseph J. Hoyle, enlisted in Cleaveland, NC in Company F, 55<sup>TH</sup> NC Troops on May 30, 1862 for the duration of the war. He was 24 years old. He was wounded on Aug. 24, 1864 sent to Hospital No. 4 in Richmond, VA, where his right leg was amputated. He died Sept. 1, 1864.

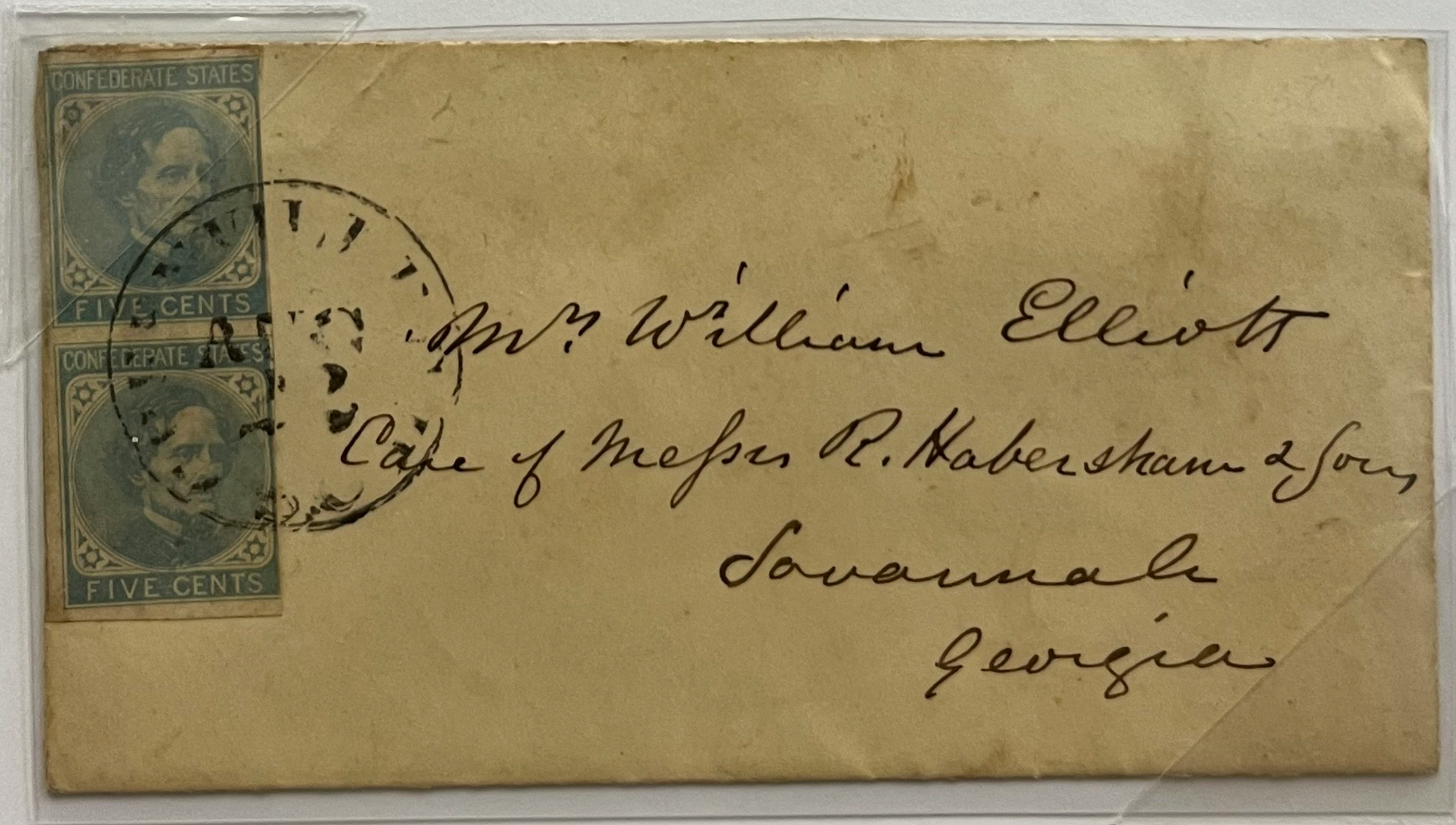

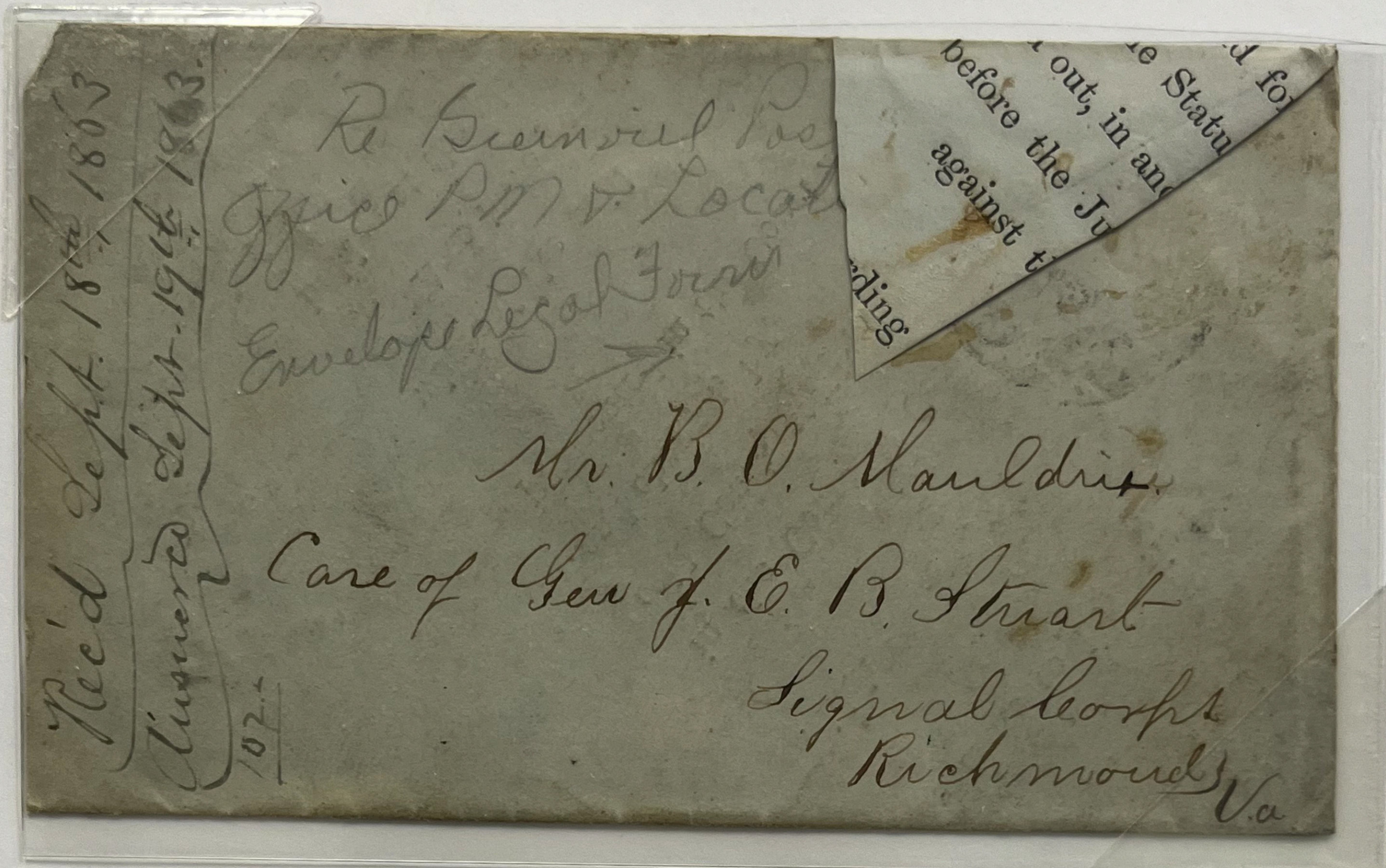

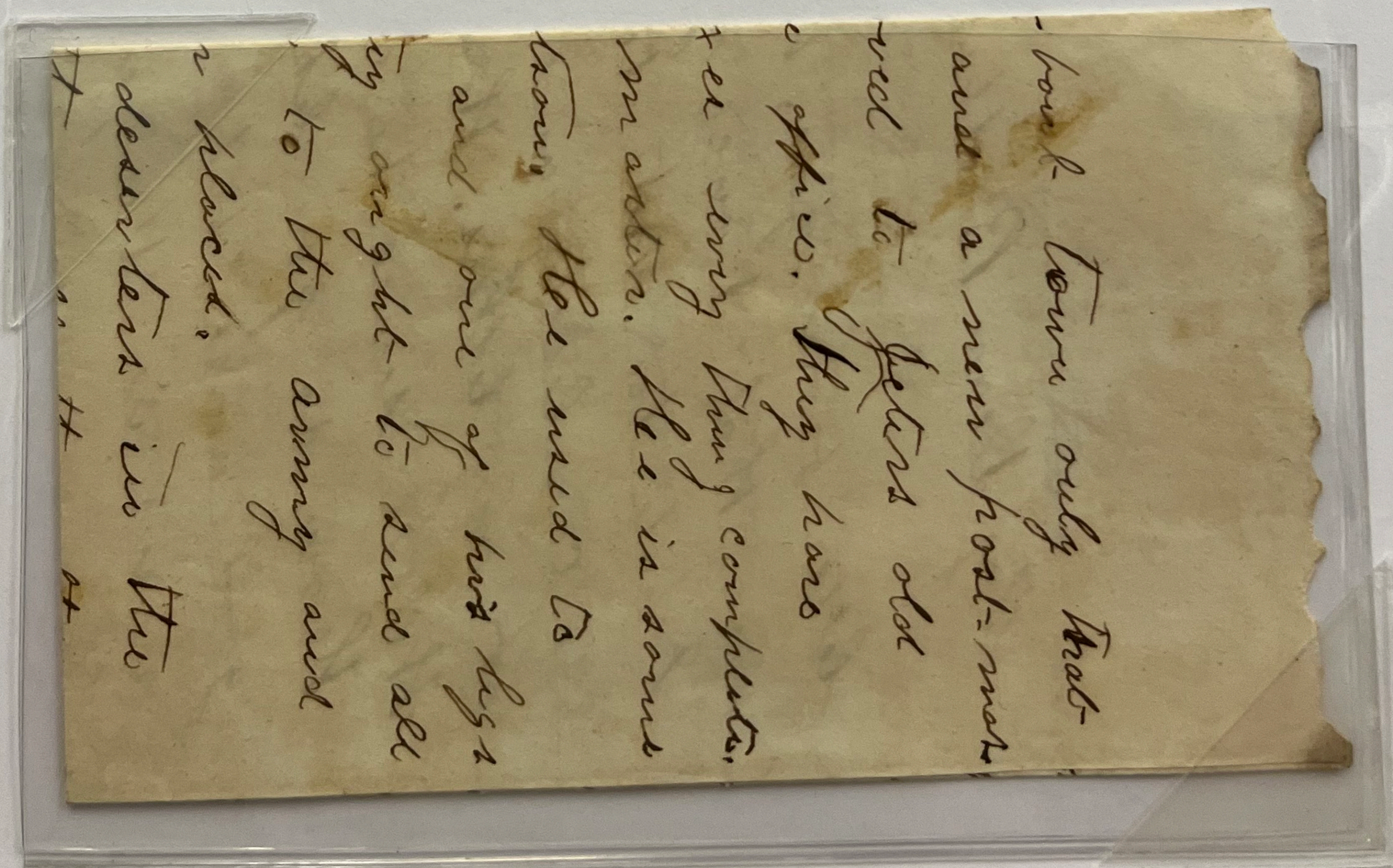

My Dear Brother

I have been waiting for a letter from you, but as you do not write, I suppose that I owe you a letter. I have got so that I hate to write to any one, as Ma says I write so carelessly and badly that persons will laugh at my letters. How many times have you seen Willie, since he came out to the Brooks Troop? How do you like his horse? I think it is a good horse, but not very pretty. What is the news in Virginia and the army? Does the government supply you with clothing?

How is Lady Kilare getting on? The news from Charleston is pretty bad. Last night the news came that Beauregard had evacuated Morris Island and had spiked the guns in Batteries Wagner and Gregg and carried all the troops to the city in safety all but one barge with twelve or fifteen men (in) it. Gilmore had summoned Fort Sumter to surrender, but Beauregard told him he could have it when he took it and not before.

There is not much news about town, only that the post office has been removed, and a new postmaster appointed. It has been moved to Jeters old Bookstore, and it makes a fine office. They have plenty of room and new boxes, everything complete. Mr. Sam Dowthard is postmaster. He is some relation to old Mr. Billy Watson. He used to belong to the Butler Guards and one of his legs has been shot off. I think they ought to send all of the able bodied postmasters to the army and put crippled soldiers in there place.

I heard that there are more deserters in the mountains of this state than all the other places put together in the Confederacy. Everyday they bring in some. They have some soldiers that stay in the mountains to catch them and they bring in some almost every day and put them in jail. I received a letter from George Anderson last week. He is stationed near Chattanooga, and is having some warm work there. Mr. Chambliss (left) for there yesterday. Sisso says she will write soon. All send love. Write soon to your affectionate Brother.
