



2nd SC (Ingles) Light Artillery Darlington C. H., Darlington District, SC to Georgetown, SC



2 tied on a turned cover front by a black 34mm DARLINGTON C. H. SC CDS, dated NOV 27 (no year date). Addressed to Sergt. C. Bacot Law, Care of Capt. Warley I(Ingles) L (Light) A (Art'y), GEORGETOWN, SC. Reverse is cover from CHARLESTON SC dated FEB 19 1861 to DARLINGTON, SC.

No. 124
Sergeant Cyrus Bacot Law enlisted on Mar 2 1862 for the duration of the war. He spent most of the war in SC, was hospitalized in Apr 1864 in Florence and later sent to James Island. In Sept was detailed to a special order under Major Warley in Florence. No other records exist after 1864




