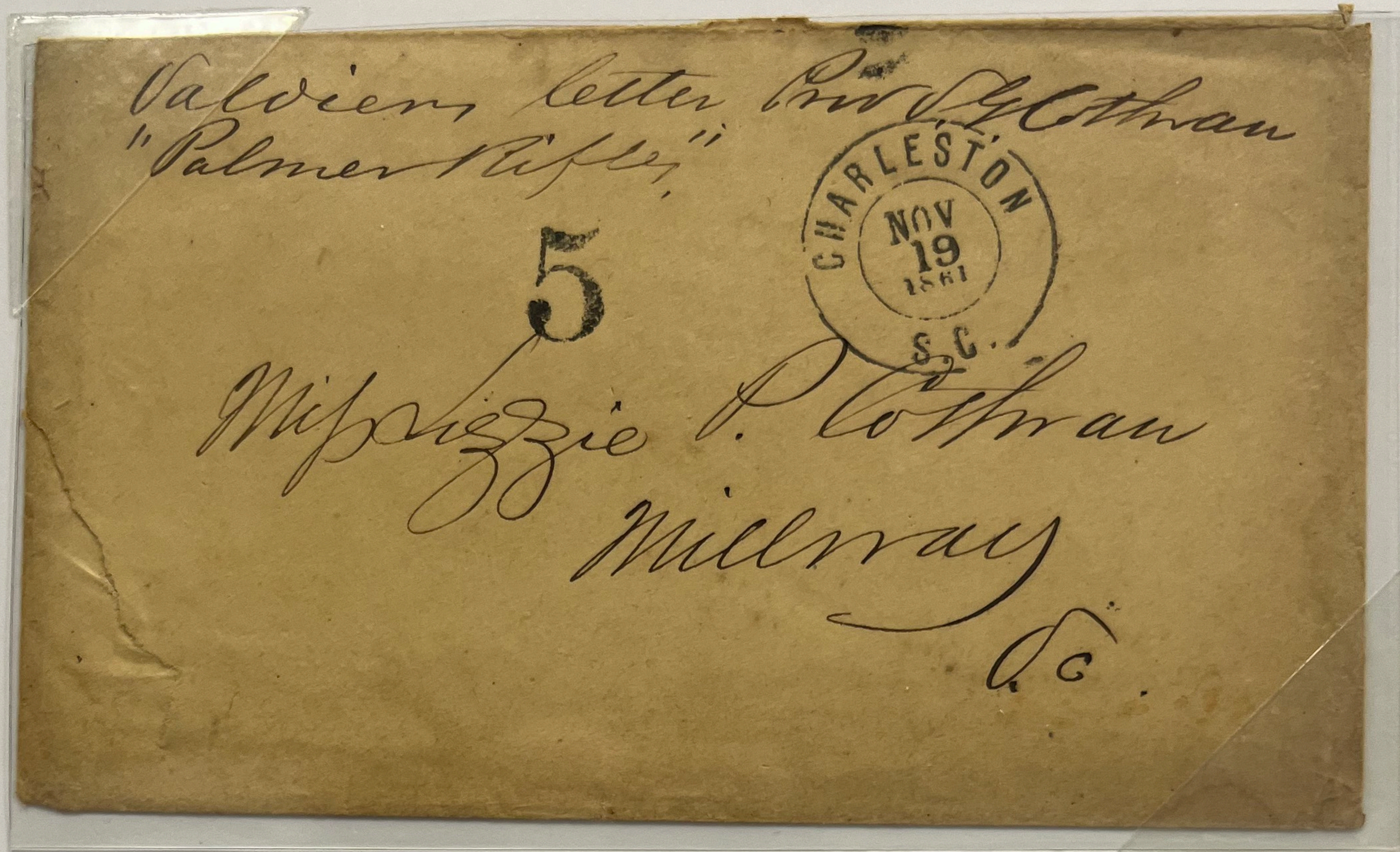

Harrison Haynes was a Private in Company F, 1<sup>st</sup> Reg't SC Cavalry. He enlisted on  
Apr. 8, 1862 in Colleton District for the duration of the war. He served throughout  
the war, however he spent three periods of hospitalization through 1864.

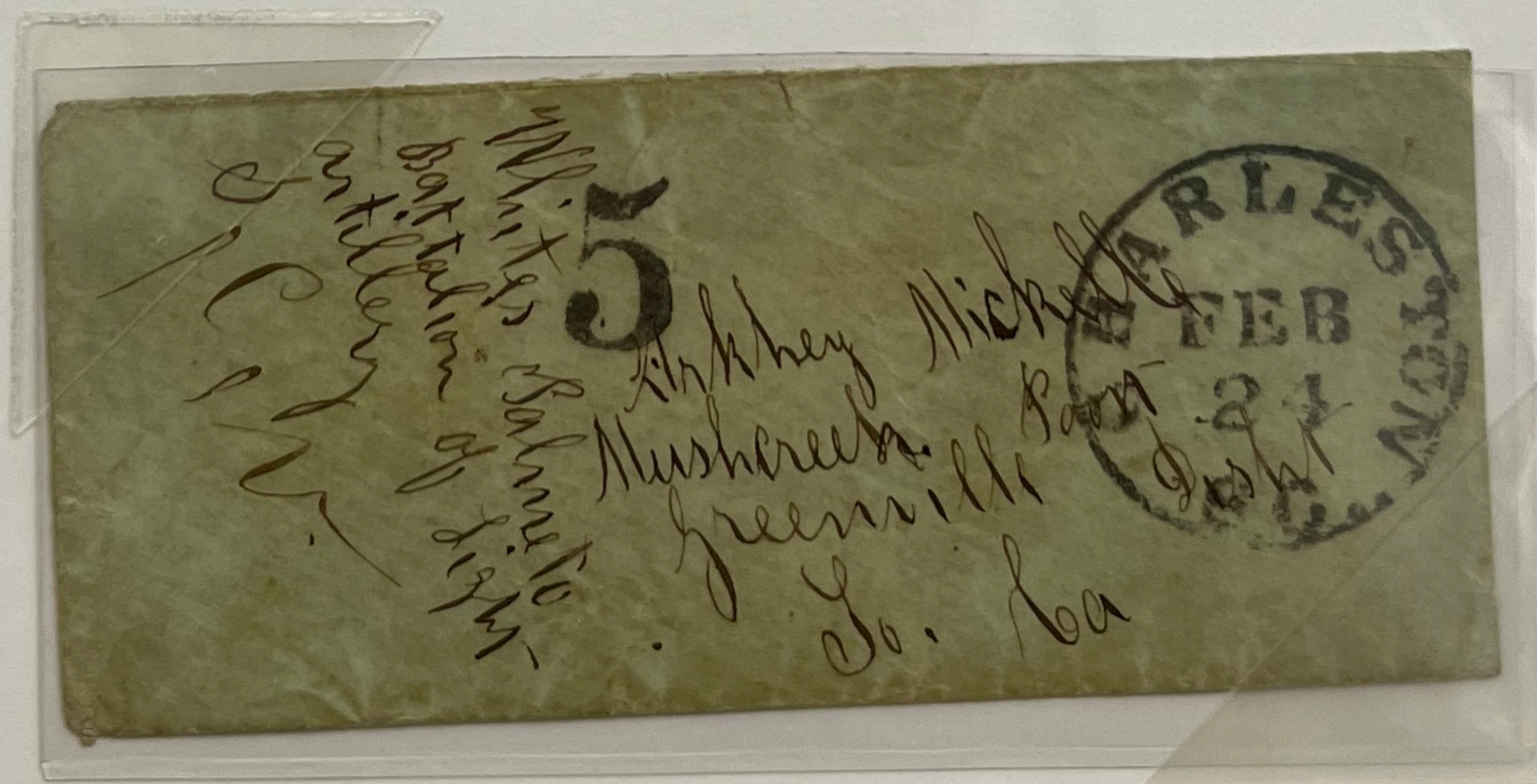

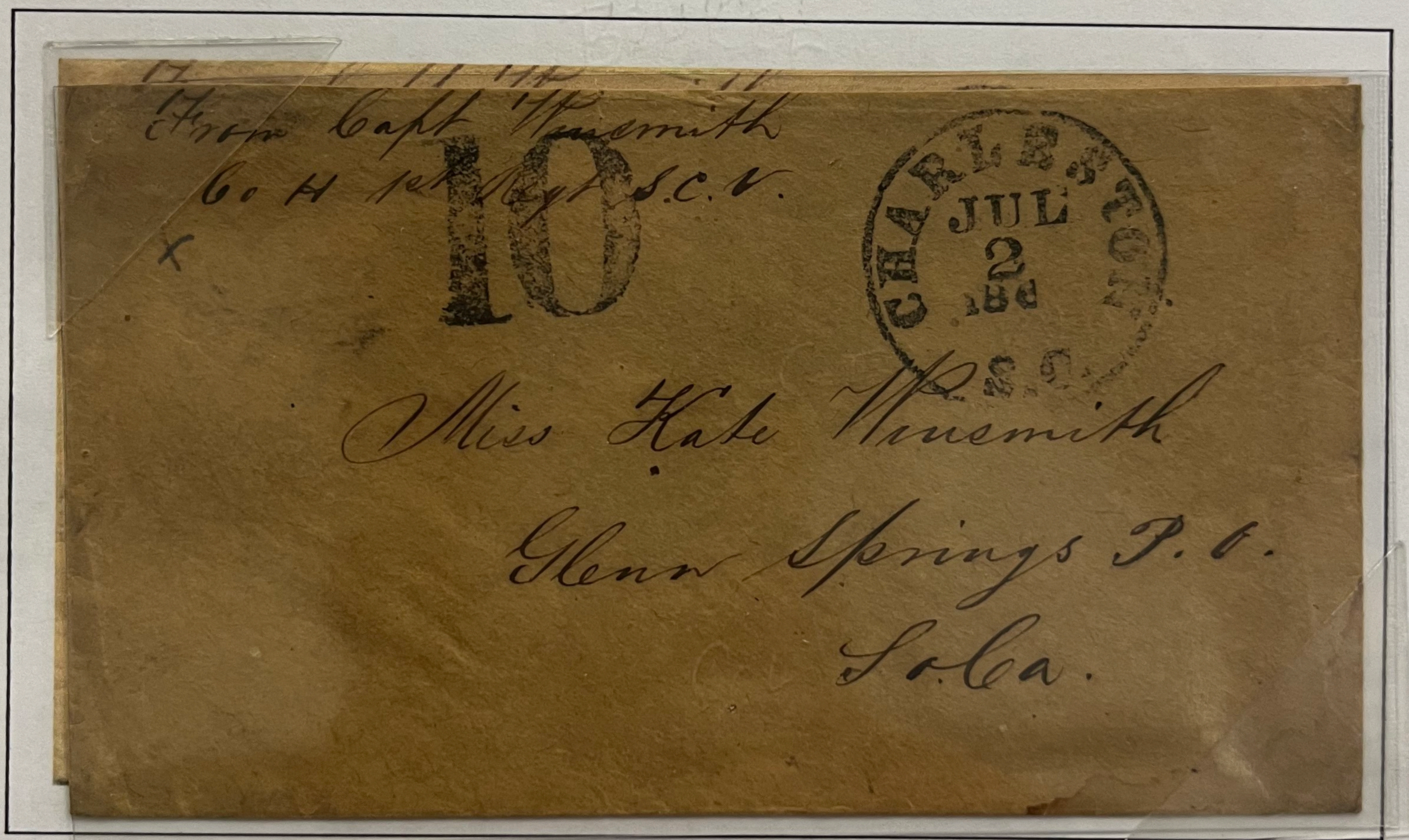

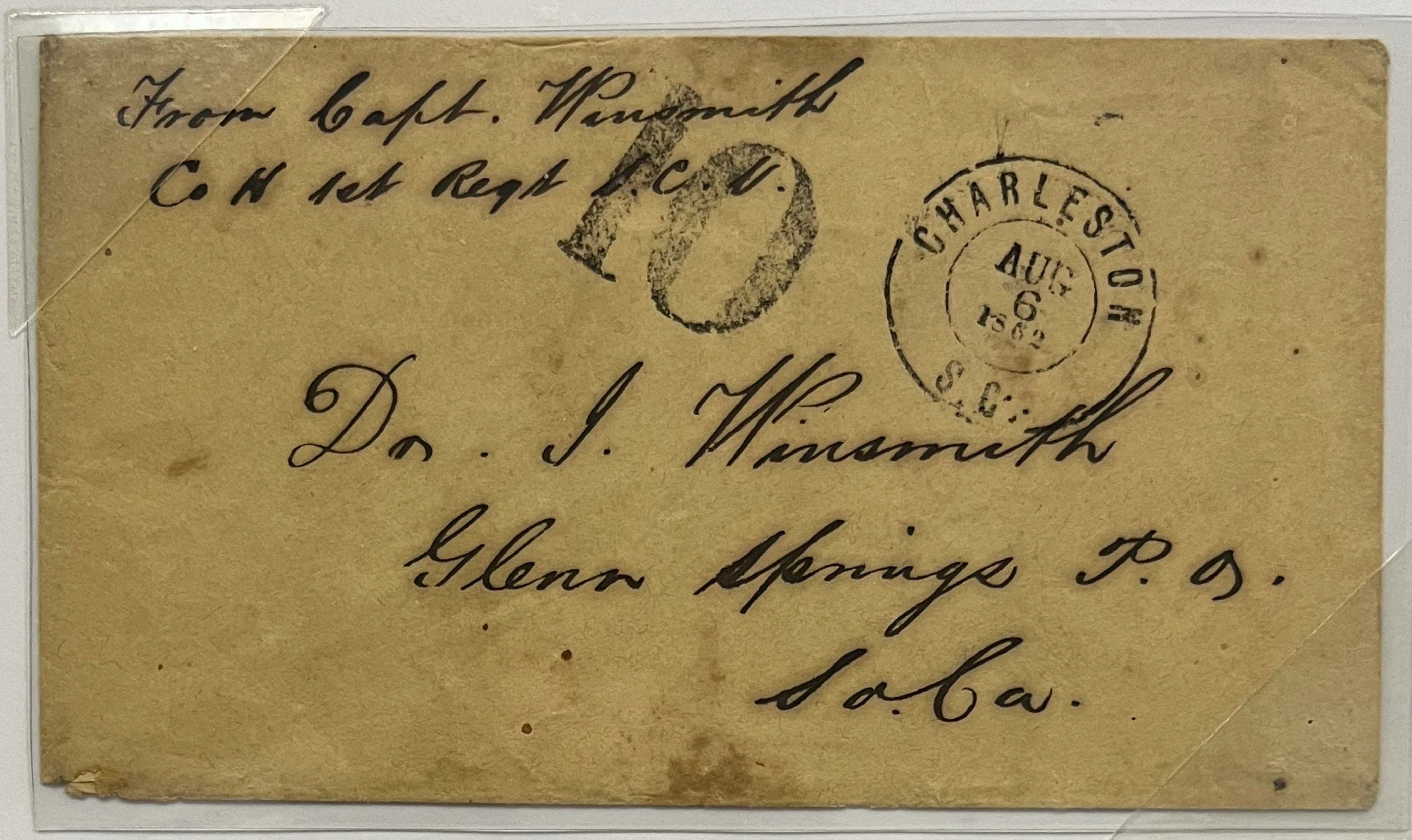

**John Christopher Winsmith was elected Captain of Co. H, 1<sup>st</sup> Reg't SCV on April 15, 1862. He was 28 years old. He enlisted in March 1862 and was wounded at Sharpsburg on 17 Sept. 1862, After his recovery he was severely wounded in the charge on Fort Harrison, Petersburg, Va. He survived the war to continue his career as a lawyer.**

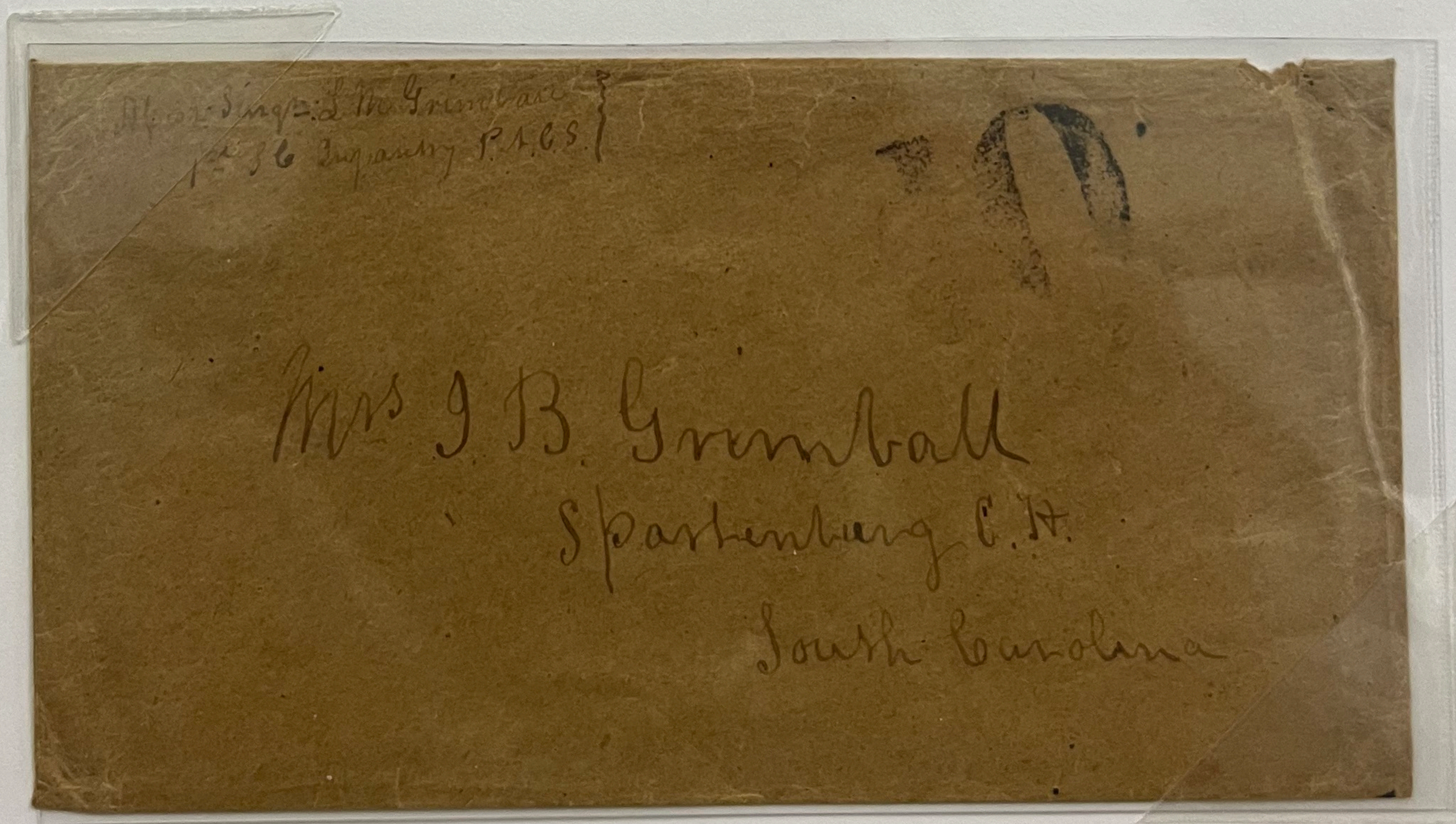
