



Manuscript Crow Creek (SC) Mar. 24, (1865), with a manuscript Paid 10 cnts. Cover is addressed to Mr. James E. Hagood. Esq., PICKENS C. H., So. Ca. The Mar. 24, 1865 use is very late in the war. Gen'l Sherman has already marched through Georgia and South Carolina. Gen'l Lee surrendered April 7th; two weeks later. The town of Crow Creek is unlisted in the CSA Catalog and Handbook. The cover has a small enclosure:

"SO CA Pickens District, March the 24th 1865 To Mrs. David Lawson - I have a Note on David Lawson for \$10.62 which I will leave with Mr. J.E. Hagood - You can pay him And git the Note at your pleasure - it is a Note he give T. W. Steward - Thomas Stewart - June the 4th 1863 - Mr. J. E. Hagood} Please send this to her and I will send you the Note before long"

Crow Creek was a United States Post Office from 8/22/1857 to 3/16/1858 and again from 3/21/82 to 12/31/1949. The Post Office was re-established by the Confederate Postal Service in 1862.

J. E. Hagood You can pay him and git the Note at your Pleasure it is a Note he give G. Driving Direct W. Stewart June the 4th 1863" signed Thomas Stewart with note to "Mr. J.E. Hagood Please Send this to her and i will send you the Note Before long" UNLISTED IN THE CSA CATALOG in any form. Crow Creek is 4.5 miles SE of Pickens in western SC and still listed today as a populated place.
