


# Military Soldier's Due

## 5<sup>th</sup> REG'T SCV

**Tudor Hall, VA to Smith's Store, Spartanburg District, SC**




**Stampless soldier's due cover with a black 32mm YD TUDOR HALL, Va CDS dated Feb 23 1862 and handstamp arc "Due 10", Dietz Type II. Addressed to Miss L. Minnie Smith, SMITH'S STORE P. O., Spartanburg District, South Carolina. From Private E. C. Smith, Co G, 5<sup>th</sup> Reg. SCV. No. 482**

**Eliphas C. Smith enlisted in Spartanburg C. H., SC for 12 months on April 1861. He served on Sullivans Island and went with his Reg't to Virginia. He was hospitalized with diarrhoea and then discharged from service May 31, 1862.**

**Culpepper C. H. Virginia to Glenn Springs, SC**



**Soldier's due cover with black 32mm CULPEPPER C. H. VA CDS dated JAN 14. Handstamp "arc Due 10", Dietz Type I. Cover from Capt. J. C. Winsmith, Co. H, 1<sup>st</sup> S.C.V. Addressed to Miss Kate Winsmith, GLENN SPRINGS P. O., South Carolina. No. 113**

**John Christopher Winsmith was elected Captain of Co. H, 1<sup>st</sup> Reg't SCV on April 15, 1862. He was 28 years old. He enlisted in March 1862 and was wounded at Sharpsburg on 17 Sept. 1862, After his recovery he was severely wounded in the charge on Fort Harrison, Petersburg, Va. He survived the war to continue his career as a lawyer.**

**Richmond, VA to Mount Pleasant, Laurens District, SC**



**Stampless soldier's cover with a black 32mm YD RICHMOND Va CDS dated JUN 4, 1863, and handstamp "DUE 10"(Dietz Type V), from a soldier in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, S.C.V. Addressed to Mrs. W. A. Nelson, MT. PLEASANT, Laurens Dist., So. Ca.**

**No. 942**

**Private W. A. Nelson was 20 years old when he enlisted on 14 April 1861, in Laurens District, into Co. F, 3<sup>rd</sup> SC Infantry. On July 29, 1862 he was furloughed due to an accidental wound. After rejoining his company he was seriously wounded at Fredericksburg 12 Dec. 1862. He rejoined the service in July 1863. He was wounded on May 8, 1864 and was captured. He was released from Pt. Lookout on June 29, 1865 after taking the oath of allegiance.**

**Richmond, VA to Clayton's Mills, Pickens District, SC**




**Stampless cover with a black 32mm YD RICHMOND VA CDS, dated NOV 8 1861 and handstamp "DUE 5", (Dietz Type III). Cover from W. C. Clayton, Private in Co. I, 4<sup>th</sup> Regt S.C.V. Addressed to Mrs. Sarah A. Clayton, CLAYTON'S MILLS, Pickens Dist., So Ca.**

**No. 196**

**W. C. Clayton enlisted on April 14, 1861 in Pendleton, SC, For 1 year. He re-enlisted as 1<sup>st</sup> Sergeant, for 2 years in Jenkins Reg't (1<sup>st</sup> Palmetto Sharp Shooters) on April 1862. He was wounded during the 7 Days Battle and had his left arm amputated on June 30, 1862. He was admitted in the General Hospital, Howard's Grove VA, on July 4, 1862. He died of his wounds on July 12, 1862**

Endorsement of W. W. Marten, 22<sup>nd</sup> Regt, SCV, Co. F. No. 994**


**William W. Marten enlisted Jan. 18<sup>th</sup>. 1862 at Camp Hampton for 12 months. He was a private in Co. F, 22 Infnry Reg't, SCV. He was 31 years old in 1861. There are no service records after his enlistment.**

**Soldier's due cover with a black 26nn DC SHREVEPORT, LA CDS dated MAY 28 with a manuscript Due 20. Cover from D. Dalby 32<sup>nd</sup> Texas, Ector's Brigade. Cover was probably sent Trans-Mississippi River and posted in Shreveport, La, since the 32<sup>nd</sup> was stationed in Tennessee and Mississippi in 1863, 64 and 65.**

**Addressed to Mrs. Turza J. Dalby, DALBY SPRING, Bowie Co., Texas. No. 278**

**G. (Green) D. Dalby was a private and later Sergeant in Co. H , 32<sup>nd</sup> Texas Cavalry (and 15<sup>th</sup> Texas Calvary) commanded by Col. Crump. Pvt Dalby enlisted on Feb. 19, 1862 at Boston, TX for a 12-month duration. In April 1863 he was assigned special duty as a Hospital Seward. On April 5, 1864 he reenlisted for the duration of the war. The 32<sup>nd</sup> was stationed in Shelbyville, TN from August 1862 through February 1863. In May of 1863, the unit was in Vernon, MS and fought at Chickamauga, then stationed at Camp Jim Dixon, Brandon, MS and from April 1864 at Lauderdale Springs, MS. On May 4, 1865 Dalby and his unit surrendered at Citronelle, AL. He was on the role of prisoners at Meridian, MS on May, 9 1865 and then paroled.**
