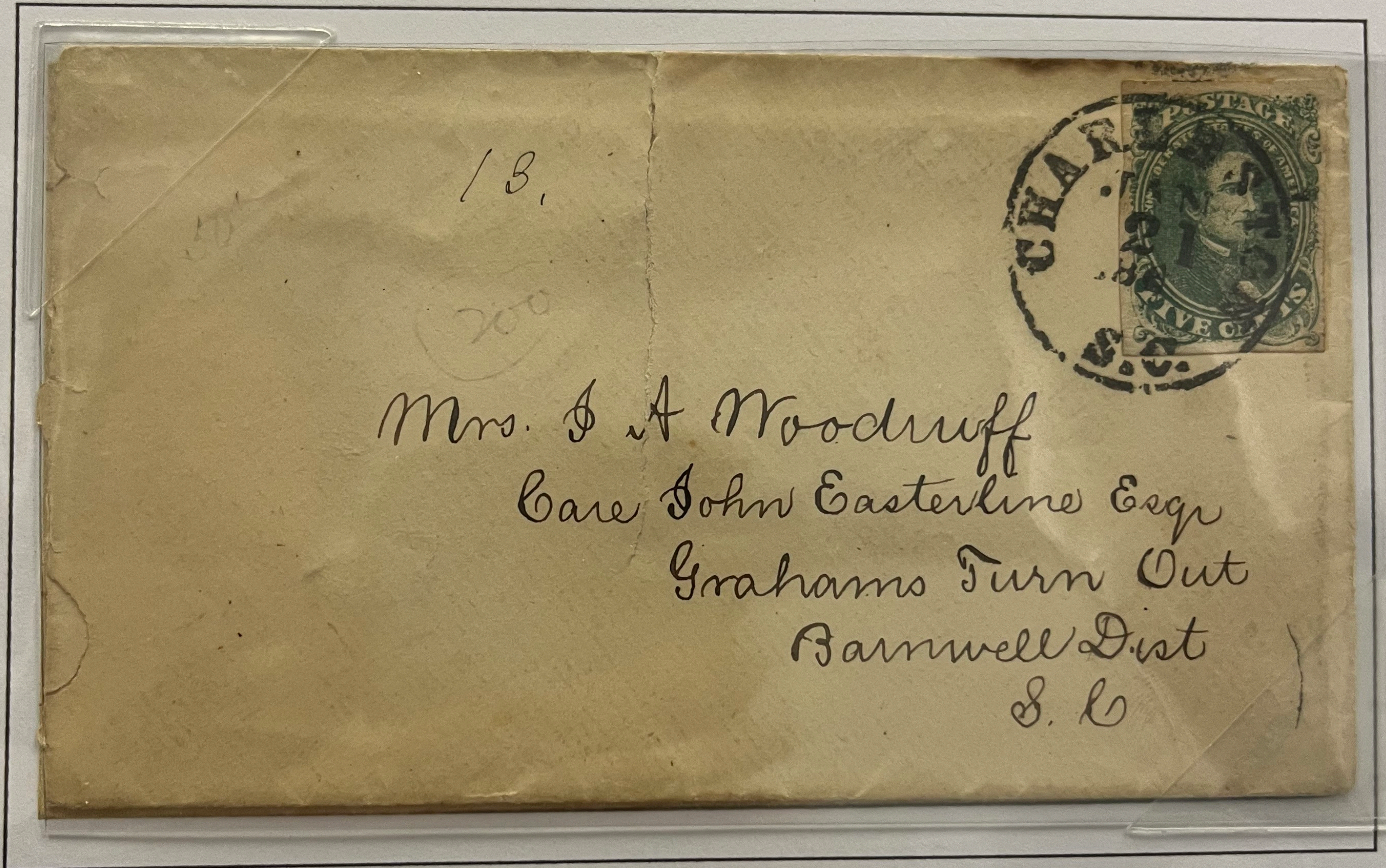

Dr. Renley Smith Butler (1834-1875) was born in Georgia and practiced medicine in Palatka, Florida. He was initially a private in Co H 2nd FL Infantry. He was discharged (medically) from the Confederate service in 1862 due to his blindness. However somehow he made as miraculous recovery as he showed up later in the war as an Asst. Surgeon in 1863, with the 20th SC infantry on Sullivan's Island.

Dr Thomas Lining, Sr. (1799-1868) was born in Charleston and received his medical degree from the University of Maryland, Baltimore. He was appointed Confederate Surgeon in 1861 at Ft Moultrie, SC and in 1862 became a Surgeon & Medical Purveyor in Charleston.

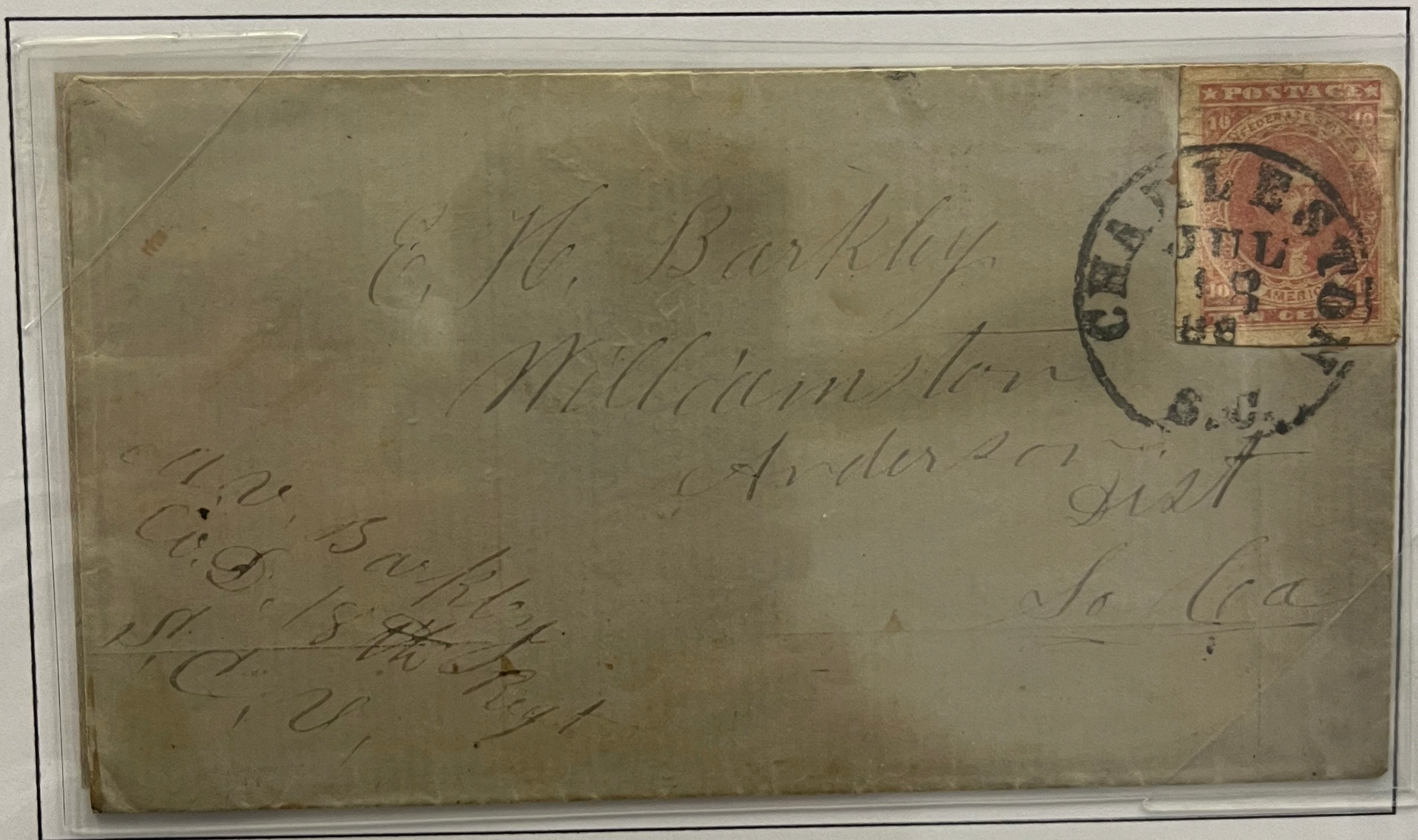
The "WAY" marking indicates this cover was received by the mail carrier on his way from another post office to what is believed to be CHARLESTON (the WAY handwriting is the same as others from Charleston), where it was put into the mail for delivery. The carrier received 1ct for this additional service. Salter's Station (Depot) was on the Northeastern Railroad route. It connected the Santee River and the city of Charleston. Dr. Boyd was one of the contractors who hired slave labor to work on the railroads.

I never have been more pestered about George, E. H. Lucinda & mother I think if I live I will get to come home once moore But it may be some I sent a paper of needles by Mr Slaten to mother I will close for the present Write all the news aunt Polly I would like to see you Write soon

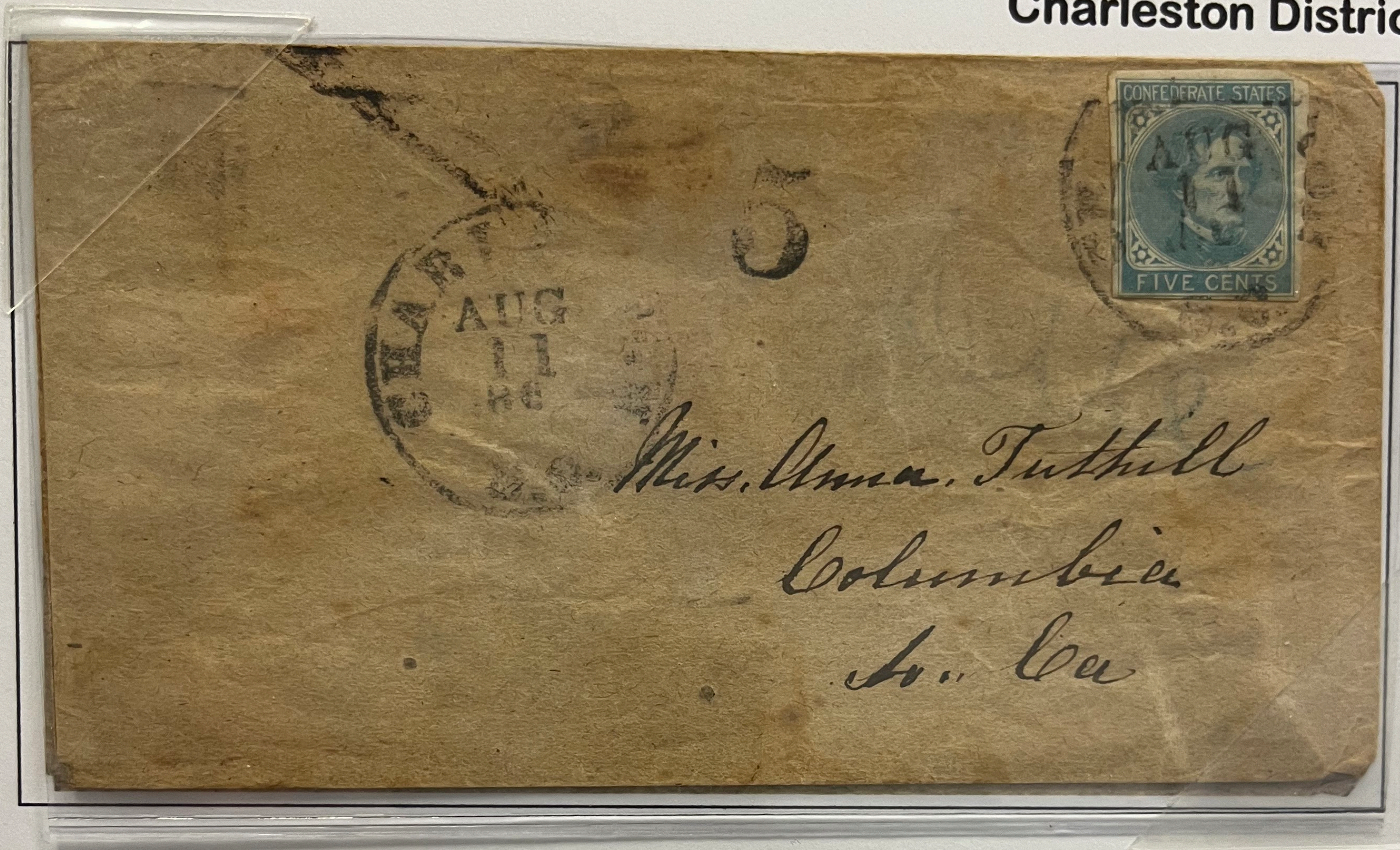

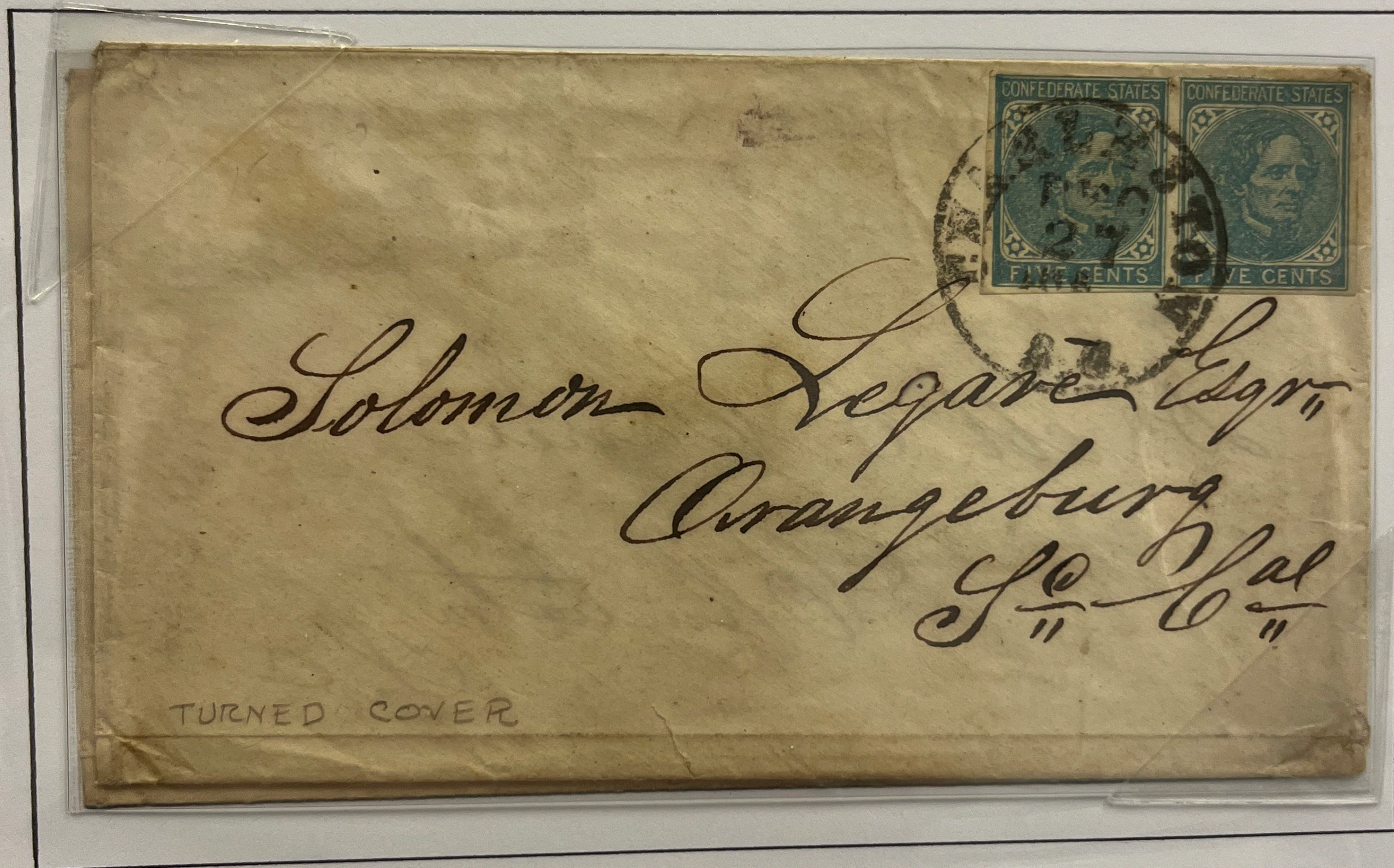

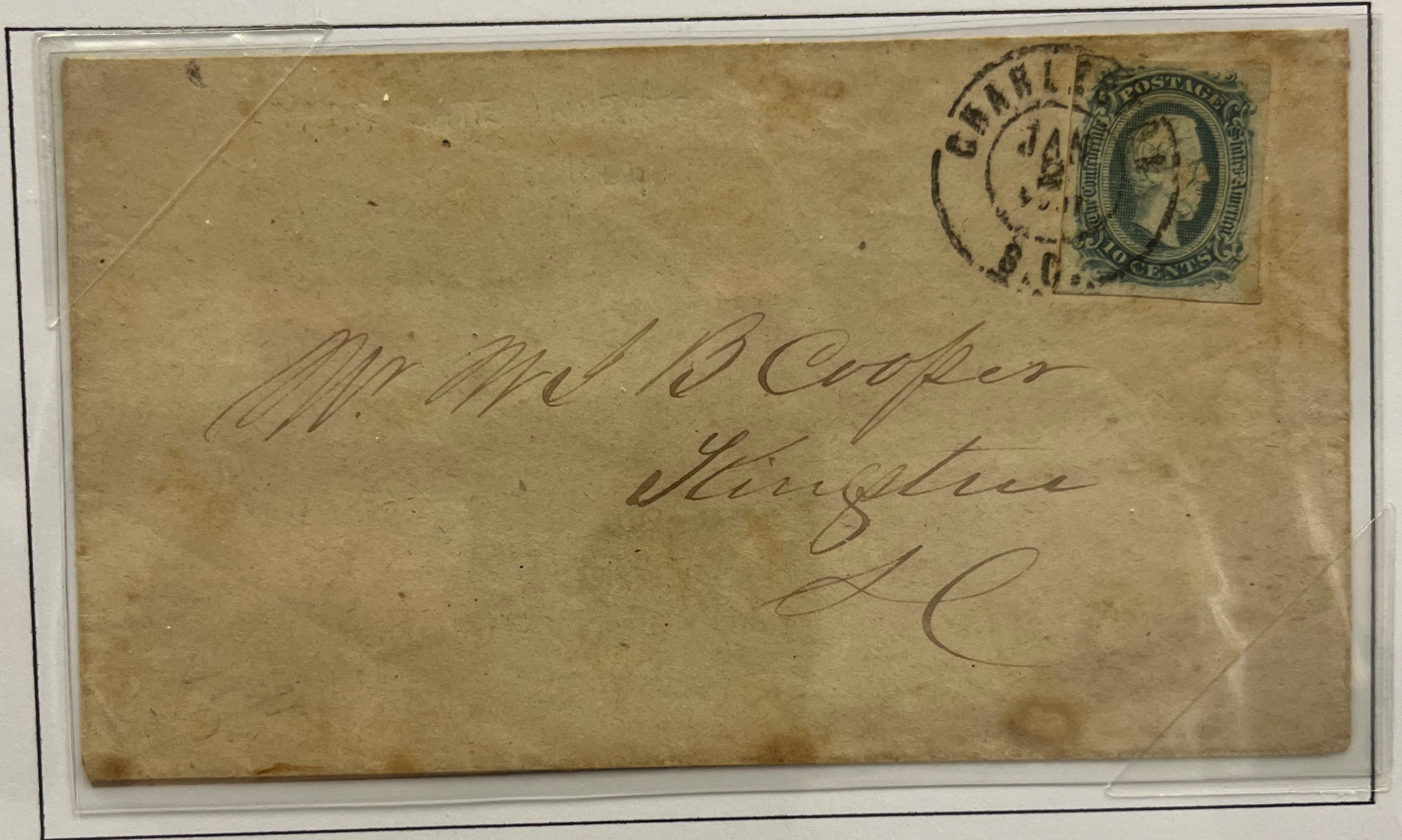

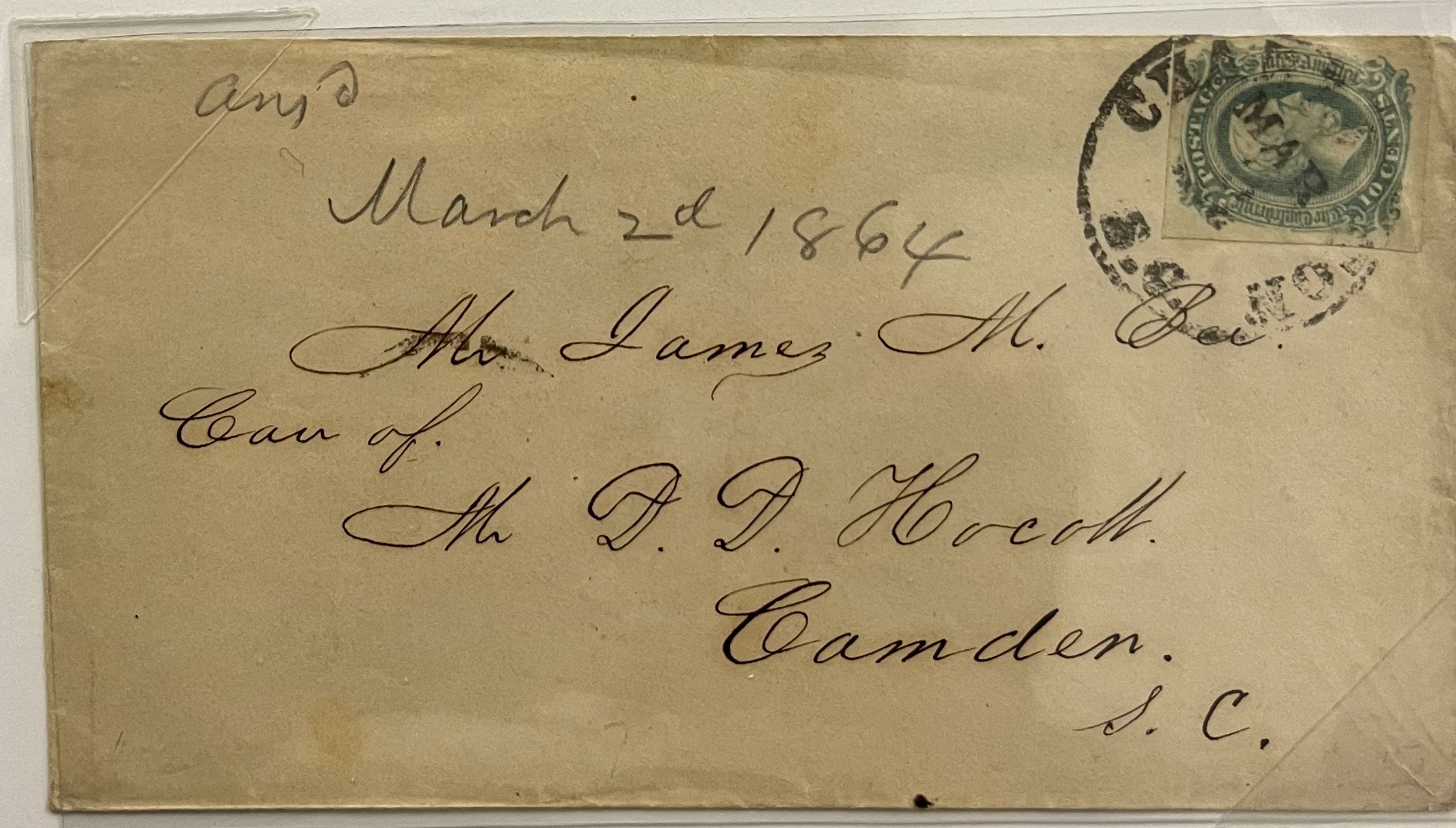

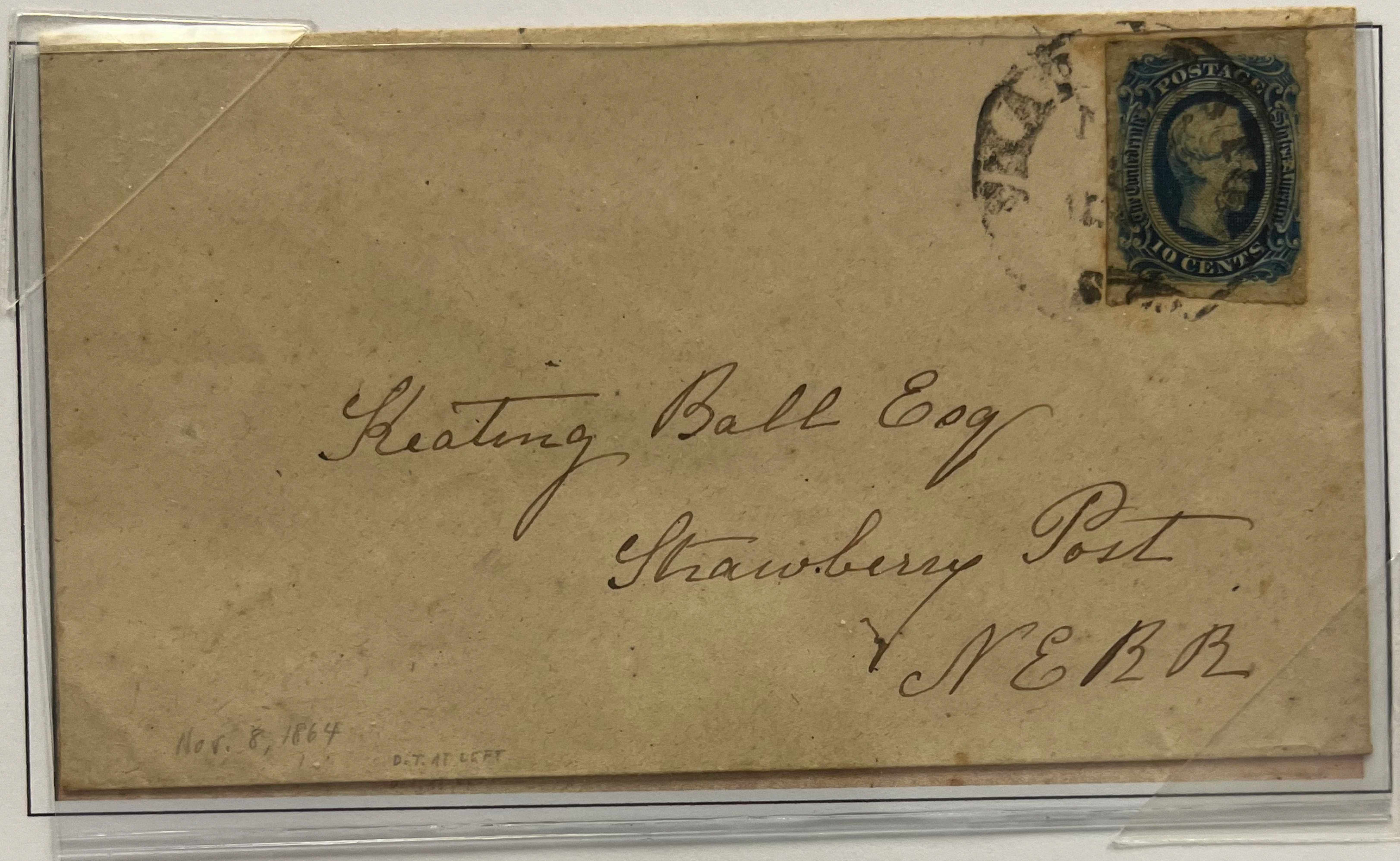

CSA # 12 (KEATING & BALL) tied by a 32 mm CHARLESTON, SC CDS dated NOV 8 (1864). The addressee, Keating Ball, Esq, has no relation to the printing company of Keating and Ball. He was a prominent planter in the Charleston District and owned Comingtee Plantation along the Cooper River. Although Strawberry Ferry was a stop on the N.E. RR, this cover was probably sent through the private mail service established, in the early 1800s by Charleston Post Master Alfred Huger, running from Charleston and return to the plantations up the Cooper River. No. 1220

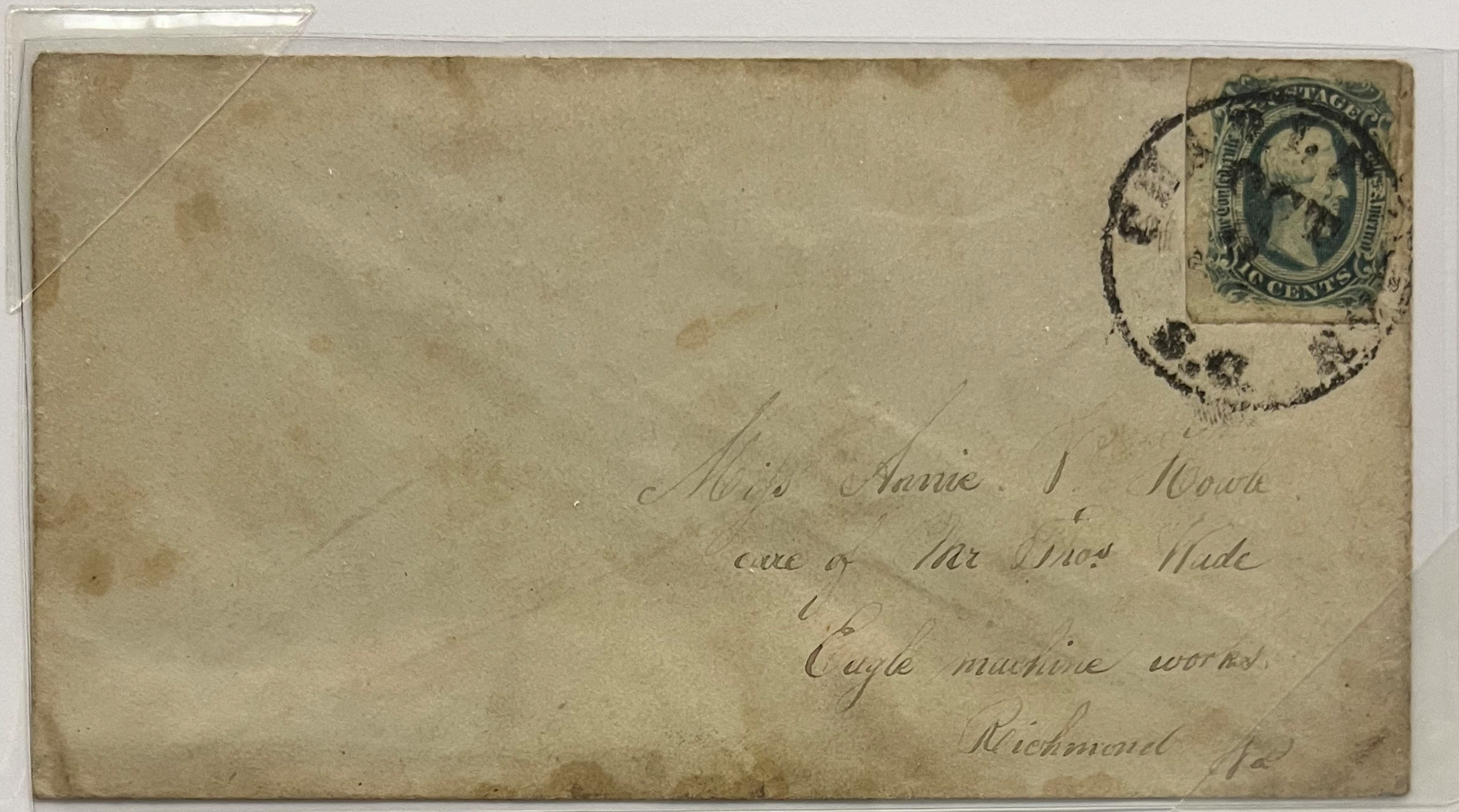

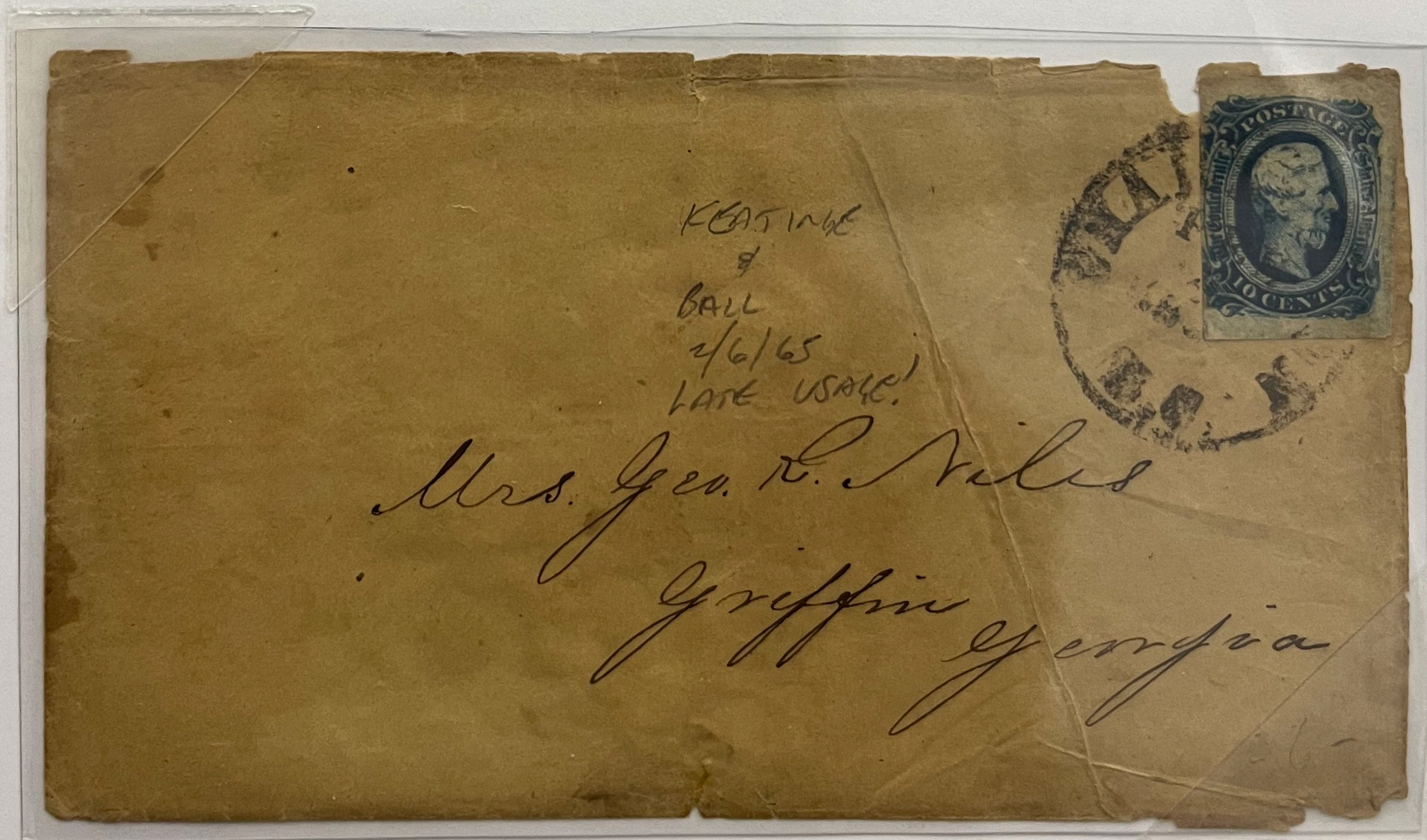
