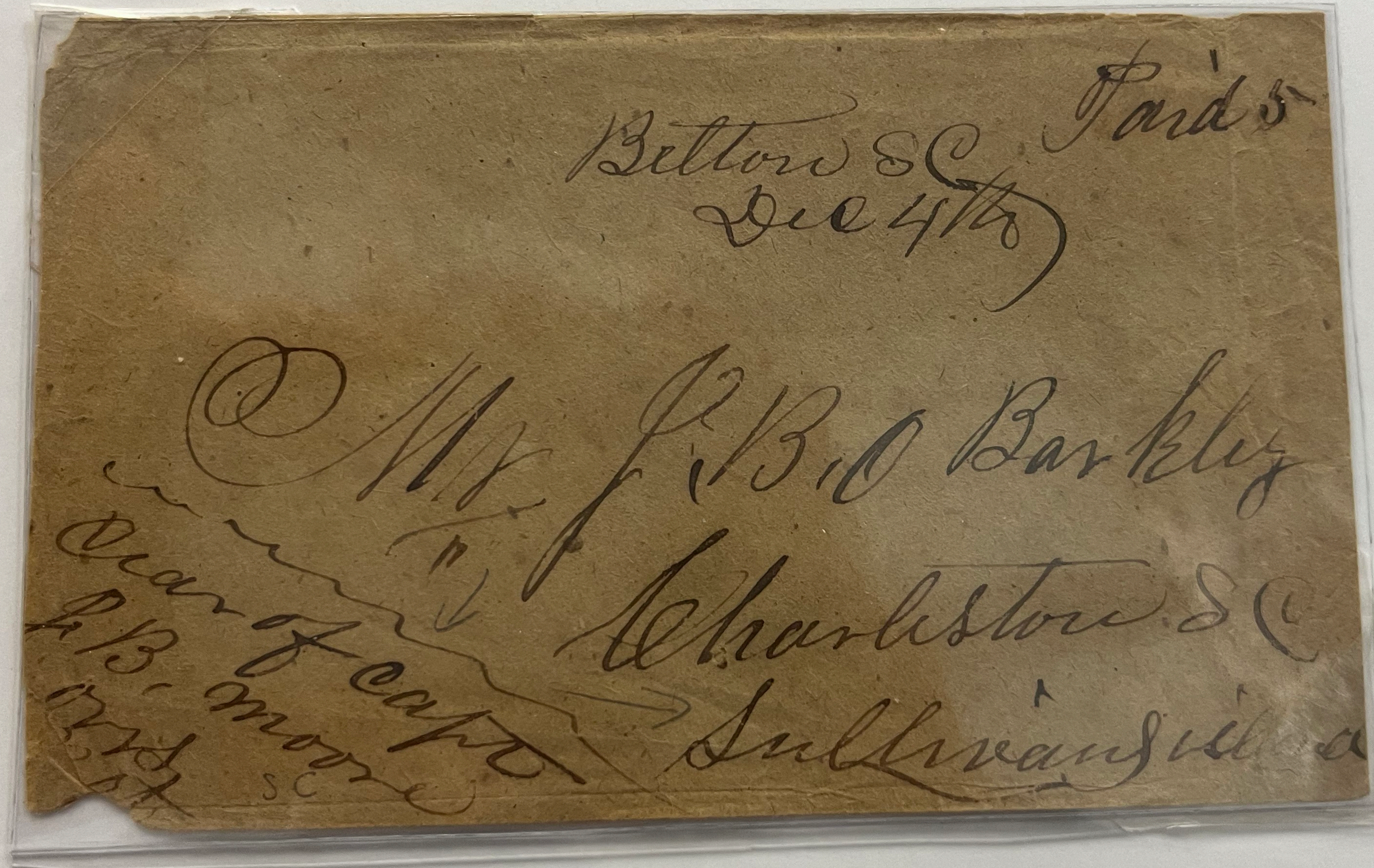

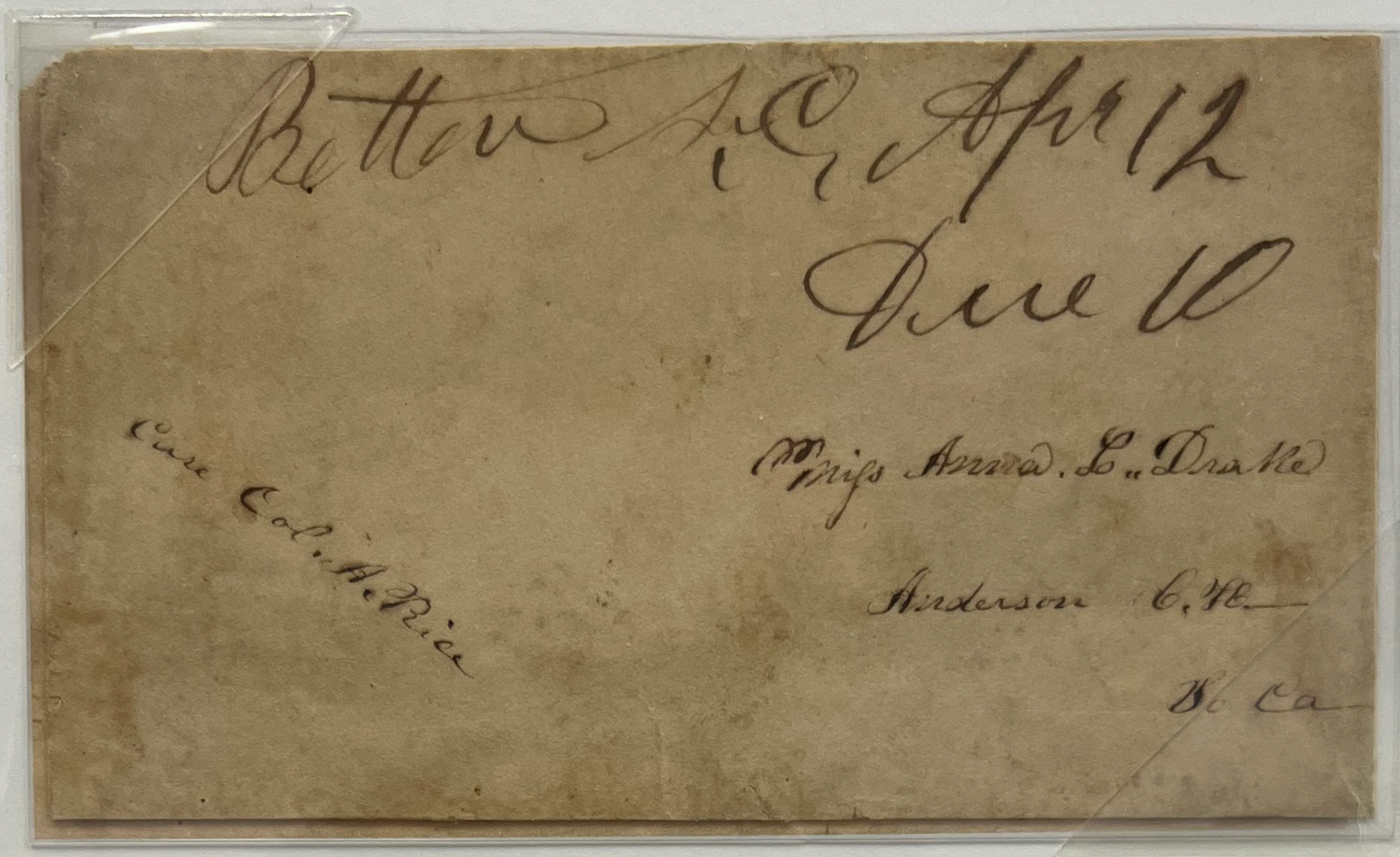

Stampless cover with manuscript BELTON S.C. Apr 12 and manuscript “Due 10”. This is not a soldier’s cover as there is no endorsement and the original letter is still with the cover, which dates the cover as 1864. Addressed to Miss Anna L. Drake, Care of Col. Rice, ANDERSON CH, So Ca. Col. A. Rice in the address, was an attorney in ANDERSON CH, and the title was honorary and not military. The enclosure is between two female cousins with only one war reference “Andy has gone to Virginia as a recruit....” The letter is signed Bettie J. McDavid, so the Andy mentioned would be her brother Andrew W. McDavid who is listed as a private in Co K, 1st SC Inf Orr’s Rifles. The “Due 10” manuscript is not in compliance with CSA postal regulations, but probably placed there as a courtesy by the Postmaster W. Sanford McGee.
