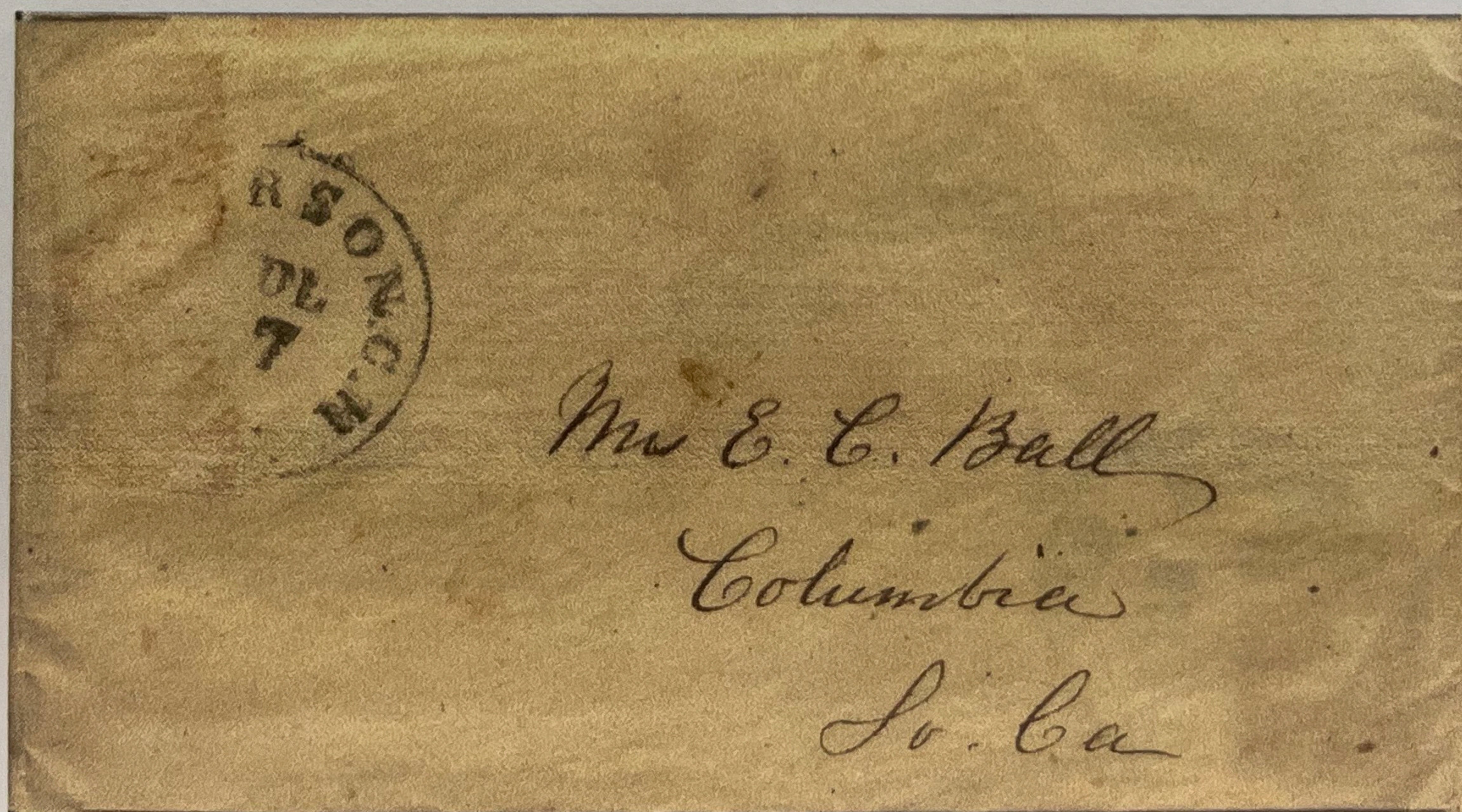

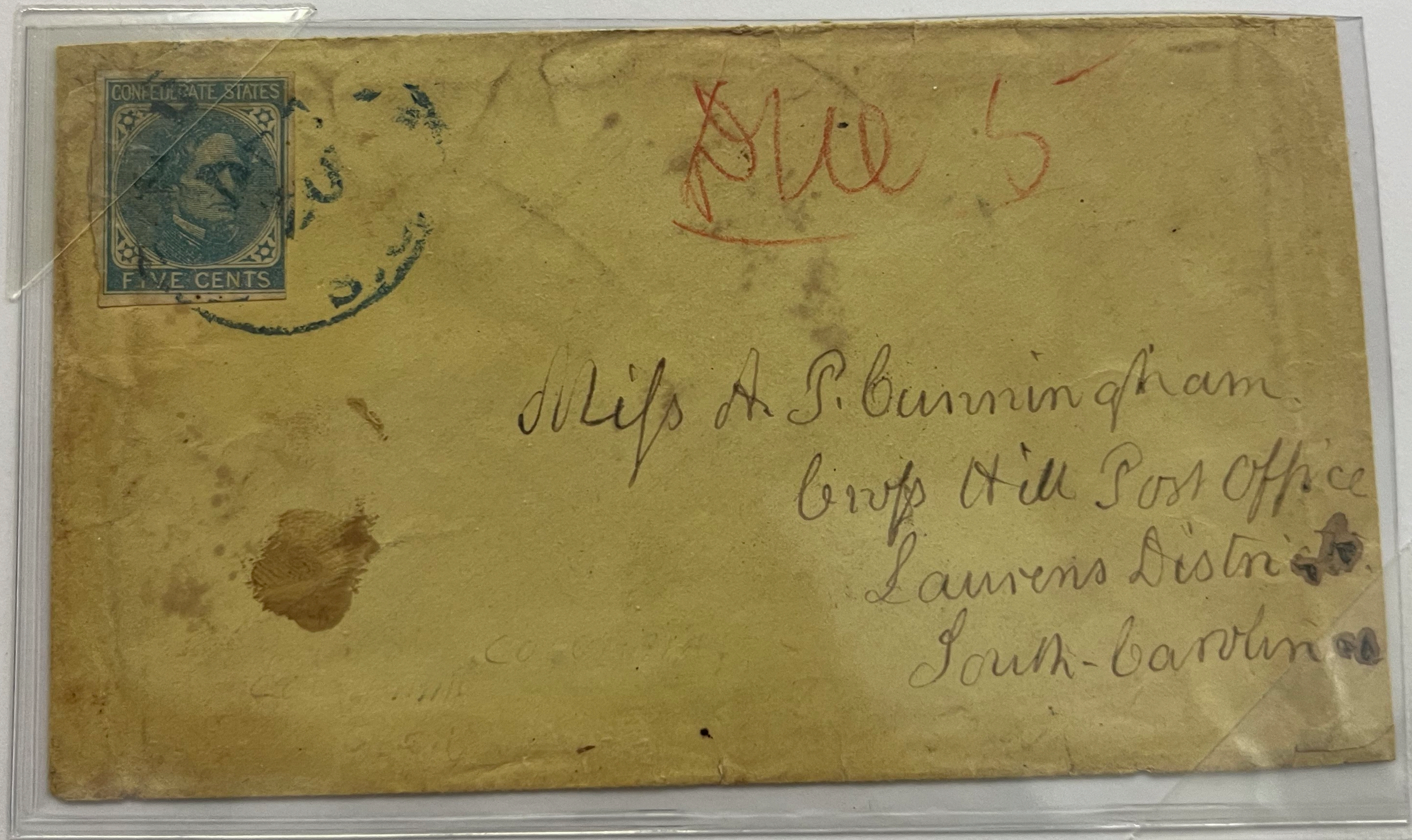
11 (Archer & Daly), tied with a 30mm Blue COLUMBIA SC CDS, docketed Aug. 21, 1863. Addressed to Mr. William J. Ball, CORDESVILLE, St John's Berkley (parish), S. C. Manuscript notation "Strawberry Ferry". There was a private mail service run from CHARLESTON to Strawberry Ferry up the Cooper River since the early 1800s, known as St. John's Post, with the drop off point was at Strawberry Ferry. Different plantations shared the pick-up and delivery of mail in the region. There was no CSA Post Office or US Post Office in Cordesville until 1892. Cordesville was served by this private mail delivery during the Confederate period. It is a turned cover with the first usage from ANDERSON C. H. SC, dated JUL 27, and addressed to Mrs. E. C. Ball, COLUMBIA, SC. Stamps are missing. No. 881

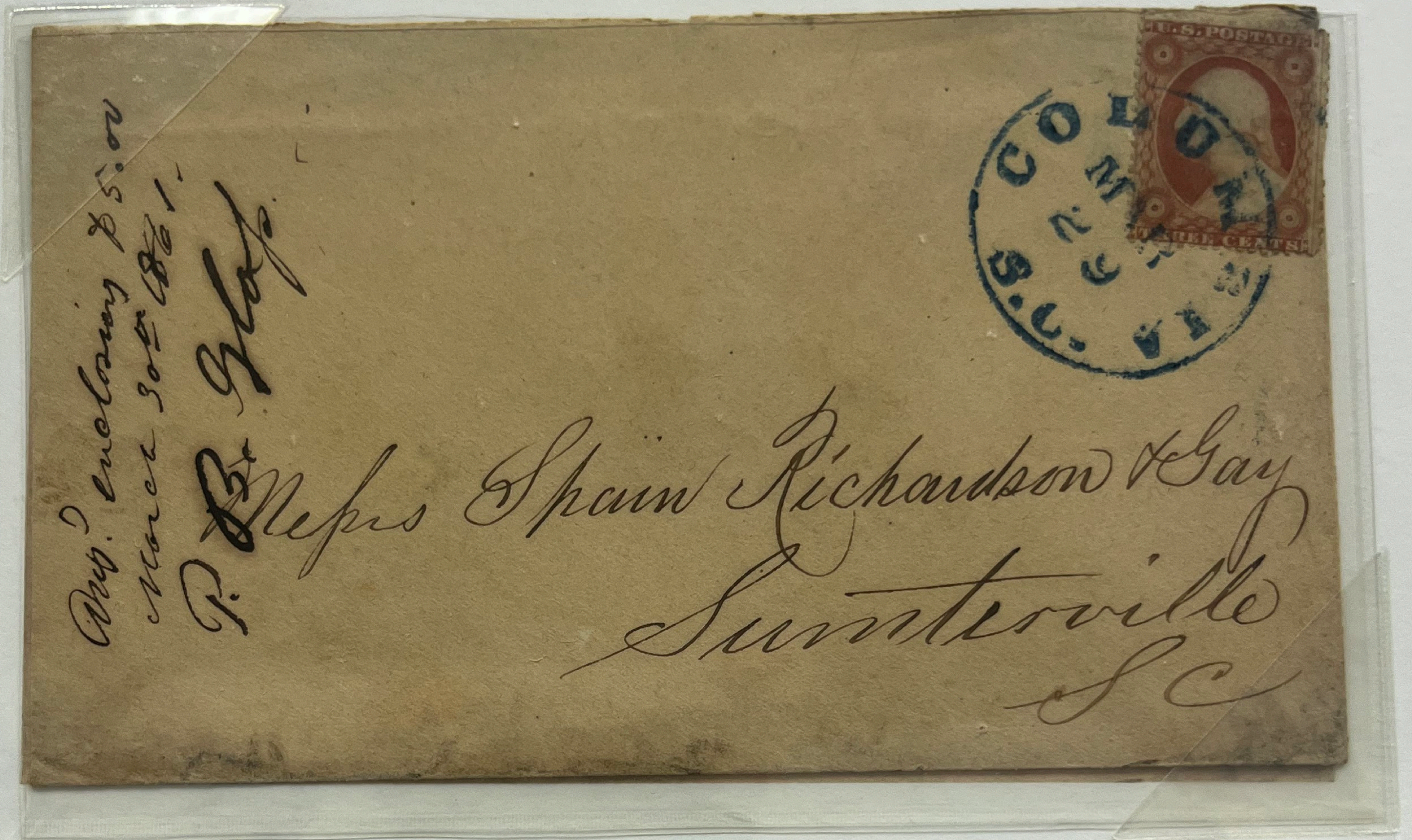
