

Grading and Condition

Superb	Extraordinary item in the finest condition.
Extremely Fine	Outstanding and exceptional quality.
Very Fine	Choice, first-class condition.
Fine-Very Fine (F-VF)	Stamp or cover in sound condition; if a stamp, it is slightly less well-centered than Very Fine but better centered than Fine.
Fine	Sound in all respects. Perforated stamps will have the designs clear of the perforations; the designs of imperforate stamps will not be cut in to any significant degree.
Very Good (VG)	Imperfect centering (stamps) or poor general appearance.

Any stamp faults such as a thin spot, tear, crease etc., will be described at all times. Postally used covers should be expected to have the normal degree of wear associated with them and this wear is not grounds for return. The grade of a cover is independent of the grade of the stamps on it. Covers from the famous Carroll-Hoy correspondence will normally have a small unobtrusive staple hole. In lots containing several items, degrees of condition denote the overwhelming average and examples above and below such condition can be expected.

Terms of Sale

Bidding

I. All bids (whether by floor bidders, mail bidders, or telephone bidders) will have a premium of 18% added to the auction sale price.

II. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to sale, to divide a lot, or to group two or more lots, or to act on behalf of the seller. Schuyler Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids. Schuyler Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. is not liable for bidding errors related to live auction internet bidding and/or the loss of internet connection during the live auction.

III. The highest bidder shall prevail; lots are sold at one increment over the second highest bid. Should any dispute arise between bidders, the decision of the auctioneer as to the successful bidder and the reoffering or resale of the lot under dispute shall rest entirely on the judgment of the auctioneer. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and reserve the right to refuse any bid believed by him not to be made in good faith.

IV. Consignor has and retains the right to bid personally, or by his duly appointed agent, through the auctioneer, unless the sale is advertised and announced as one restricting such bidding by consignors or their agents.

Payments of Purchases

V. FLOOR BIDDERS. Floor bidders shall furnish the auctioneer their names and addresses prior to bidding on any lot. The name and address of the buyer of each lot shall be registered with the auction house following the sale of each lot. Payment of the whole purchase price shall be made by the floor buyer in such manner as the auctioneer may determine. Special credit arrangements must be made prior to the sale.

VI. MAIL BIDDERS. A successful mail bidder will be notified of lots purchased and must remit payment before the lots are sent. Auction bills are due and payable upon receipt of notification. If buyer's payment is not received within ten (10) days, Schuyler Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. may resell all lots without notice. Any and all losses incurred as a result of resale will be passed on to the defaulting buyer. Cost of postage, registration, etc. will be charged to buyer. Proof by the auctioneer of receipt of sending at the advised address shall constitute delivery.

VII. DIRECT DRAFTS/TRANSFERS. A successful mail bidder known to us may contact our office at (415) 781-5127 for the information necessary to pay directly into the vendor bank account. Any additional charges resulting from processing payments by this method shall be borne by the buyer. Method of payment should be noted on the bid sheet.

VIII. Title shall not pass to the buyer until full payment is received by Schuyler J. Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc.

IX. All of our lots are sold as genuine. Lots accompanied by recent (within 5 years of sale date) expert certificates are sold "as is" based on the description in the certificate. The aforementioned expertised lots may not be returned under any circumstances including those instances in which subsequent certificates yield conflicting opinions. The accepted authorities for U.S. stamps are the Philatelic Foundation (P.F.), the Philatelic Stamp Authentication and Grading, Inc. (P.S.A.G.) and the Professional Stamp Expertizing Committee (P.S.E.). In addition, a lot may not be returned because an expertising service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description, or differs from the accompanying certificate.

X. The Auctioneer must be notified within 5 business days from the date of the auction of any request to place a lot on extension for expertising. All extensions must be paid in full, in advance. There will be no exceptions and no lots may be returned under any circumstances if this term has not been strictly followed.

XI. All lots on extension must be submitted for expertising by the auctioneer exclusively. XII. Any lot, description of which is incorrect, is returnable (A) within three (3) days of receipt and (B) if received by Schuyler J. Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact, in the condition received; no adjustments will be made. XIII. JURISDICTION. 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The Dr. James Milgram Collection of Steamboat Mail

Dr. James W. Milgram grew up in Brooklyn, New York and earned his undergraduate degree at Columbia University, followed by medical school at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He is now a Professor Emeritus of Orthopaedic Surgery, Northwestern University Medical School.

A collector since high school, Dr. Milgram amassed one of the few remaining collections covering virtually every aspect of U.S. postal history. He is a renowned expert in the field, who authored over 700 articles on postal history and 8 books including the definitive work on United States Steamboats, *Vessel-Named Markings on United States Inland and Ocean Waterways 1810-1890*. Dr. Milgram remains an active collector and is a senior member of the Collectors Club of Chicago.

A Brief History of Steamboat Mail in the United States

Steamboat pioneering began in America in 1787 when John Fitch made a successful trial of such a vessel. Robert Fulton's profitable experimentation followed, but not until 1811 was a vessel built specifically to traverse the lower Mississippi River—the *New Orleans,* built at Pittsburgh, Pa., for Fulton and Robert R. Livingston. The two men began in 1812 the operation of a regular steamboat service between New Orleans and Natchez, Miss., under a monopoly contract with the Territory of Orleans. Their vessels traveled at a rate of eight miles per hour downstream and three upstream. In 1816 Henry Miller Shreve of Shreveport, La., made history by launching his steamboat *Washington;* before long it was making the trip from New Orleans to Louisville, Ky., in 25 days. Shreve broke the Fulton-Livingston monopoly of steam navigation on the river, but his title as the father of Mississippi navigation stems more from his adaptations of steamboat design to fit the shallow waters of the river; he used a high-pressure steam engine (to make progress upstream), hoisted it high up above the water line, and mounted it on a hull that was as shallow as that of a barge. A tall second deck was added, and Shreve's experiment became the prototype of all subsequent Mississippi steamboats. From then on and until about 1870, the steamboat dominated the economy, agriculture, and commerce of the middle area of the United States. In 1814 New Orleans had counted hardly 20 steamboat arrivals; within 20 years the figure had reached 1,200. The steamboats' major cargoes were cotton and sugar, along with passengers.

Most larger steamboats were luxuriously appointed affairs; they had "lounges" in the style of ornate hotel lobbies, with rich rugs, oil paintings, and chandeliers. Many steamboats could boast of famous chefs, orchestras, and large staffs of maids and butlers to assist their cabin passengers. Steamboat pilots had to memorize or cunningly estimate the depths and potential obstacles along long stretches of river in order to navigate safely.

The average life span of a steamboat was only four to five years, owing to the vessels being poorly constructed and maintained, being sunk by snags and other obstructions in the river, or having their boilers explode. Over the years, however, the boats' speeds increased; Shreve's 25-day run from New Orleans to Louisville in 1816 had been shortened to 4.5 days by 1853. Spontaneous races between the captains of two steamboats were common and contributed greatly to the approximately 4,000 deaths in steamboat disasters between 1810 and 1850.



5 Empire, folded letter with beautifully illustrated design of the *Steamer Empire*, datelined "Buffalo, May 2, 1847" to Albany, postmarked blue "Troy, N.Y. May 4" cds with matching "V" in double circle rate handstamp, two file folds affecting the address panel, which do not detract from the beauty of this item, Very Fine and rare, the only recorded example.

The "Illinois" was a side-wheeler of 755 tons and built at Detroit in 1838. She operated in the Great Lakes trade until she was lost in 1868. This cover was postmarked during the Wisconsin Territorial period. Mayflower, folded letter with illustrated design of the Steamer Mayflower, Michigan Central Rail Road Line, datelined "June 7, 1849 on Lake Erie" to Whitesboro, N.Y., postmarked red "Detroit, Mich. Jun 9" cds with matching "10" rate handstamp, excellent letter written on board, P.S. This is the finest Boat yet built on Lake Erie, runs from Detroit to Buffalo in 16 hours - 255 miles straight through lake without stopping, Very Fine and rare, the only recorded example.







Upon arriving in Texas in 1837, Ashbel Smith quickly became well-acquainted with Sam Houston and was appointed as the surgeon general of the Republic of Texas Army. Despite the end of the Texas Revolution, Smith established an efficient medical system and founded the first hospital in what would later become Houston.



The "Columbia" ran between New Orleans and Galveston, with Ricker serving as agent for the Post Office. He would handstamp covers with his oval marking along with his "Returnable" straight line handstamp on covers to indicate the 25¢ U.S. postage had been paid by Ricker and recipient had until the first of September to reimburse Ricker for his service.

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

AN EXTREMELY IMPRESSIVE STRIKE FOR THIS RARE HANDSTAMP OF WHICH THIS IS THE FINEST RECORDED EXAMPLE.

The "Eliza Battle" was a steamboat operating on the Tombigbee River between Columbus, Mississippi, and Mobile, Alabama, during the 1850s. Launched in New Albany, Indiana, in 1852, this side-wheeled paddle steamer was constructed with a wooden hull and was 316 tons.

On March 1, 1858, the "Eliza Battle" was destroyed by fire near Pennington, Alabama, in what became the deadliest maritime disaster in the history of the Tombigbee River. The fire claimed the lives of approximately thirty-three people out of about sixty passengers and a crew of forty-five.

Around 2 a.m. on that fateful morning, about 32 miles downstream from Demopolis and near Beckley's Landing, flames were discovered engulfing cotton bales on the main deck. Fueled by strong winds, the fire quickly spiraled out of control. The passengers, trapped by the flames and unable to access the lifeboats, were forced to leap into the icy river in their nightclothes. Some managed to stay afloat by clinging to cotton bales. Rescued by the Magnolia and local residents, many survivors were retrieved from treetops along the flooded river. Tragically, all the casualties were due to drowning or exposure to the severe cold.

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The "U.S.S. Eolus" was a 368-ton side-wheel steamship that served in the Union Navy from 1864 to 1865 before transitioning to commercial use. Built in Newburgh, New York, for civilian purposes, the vessel was acquired by the Union Navy upon its completion. Commissioned as a gunboat in August 1864, the "Eolus" initially searched off the Atlantic Coast for the Confederate raider "C.S.S. Tallahassee" before joining the blockade forces off North Carolina.

The "Eolus" played a crucial role in patrolling the coast, rivers, and sounds of North Carolina. Its duties included enforcing the blockade, serving as a picket, and transporting personnel, messages, mail, supplies, orders, and ammunition to larger ships in the squadron, as well as evacuating the wounded to hospital ships. In October 1864, the "Eolus" captured the blockade runner "Hope" and contributed to the capture of the "Lady Sterling". Later in the year and into January 1865, the ship participated in the assaults that led to the capture of Fort Fisher, effectively closing the port of Wilmington to blockade runners. The "Eolus" continued operations in North Carolina waters until after the end of the Civil War.



The "Horatio G. Wright" was built by the Western Iron Boat Building Company. Launched in June 1880 after being under construction for over a year. Worked as a "snag extractor" on the Mississippi River for many years and finally dismantled in 1941.

In America's steamboat era, the main danger to waterborne travel and commerce was neither fire nor explosions, but rather snags-trees that had fallen into the rivers as a result of bank erosion.





The "Mary Bess", constructed in 1852 in Louisville, began her service in Mobile, Alabama. The following year, she was navigating the Mississippi River from New Orleans. By 1856, she was operating between New Orleans and the Red River. This stencil marking represents a distinctive and rare type of steamboat marking.

A similar strike on an 1853-55 3¢ Nesbitt entire was sold in the final sale of the Erivan Collection, sold by H.R. Harmer for \$8,000 (Sale 3070, April 30, 2024, Lot 187).

The "Mary Bess" of 206 tons was built at Louisville in 1852 for Capt. Sam Montgomery and first enrolled at Mobile. Transferred to New Orleans register in 1853 under William Kimball and D.G. Hills ownership.

The "Mary Clinton" was 206 tons and built at New Albany Ind. in 1849 for the Alabama River trade out of Mobile. She was snagged and lost at Tait Shoals on February 26th 1855.

The "Rapides" was a wooden-hull side-wheel packetboat that was built in New Albany Ind. in 1855. Originally built for C.J. Barston of Rapides Parish La., she plied the waters between New Orleans and Donaldsonville up to 1856, then later between New Orleans and Shreveport before being used by the Confederacy after 1861. The marking used on mail carried by the "Rapides" is a remarkable depiction of a Mississippi steamboat without equal among the other handstamps of the period.



AN OUTSTANDING EXAMPLE OF THIS STEAMBOAT MARKING AND ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT USAGES OF ALL OF THE INDIAN TERRITORIES.

This historic item mentions John Ross (referred to as "Dr. Ross"), who was the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation from 1828 to 1866. Ross led the nation through such tumultuous events as forced removal to Indian Territory and the American Civil War. Under orders from President Martin Van Buren, General Winfield Scott and 7,000 Federal troops forced removal of Cherokee who did not emigrate to the Indian Territory by 1838. This forced removal came to be known as the "Trail of Tears".

The "Trail of Tears" was the forcible removal of members of the Cherokee, Muscogee, Seminole, Chickasaw, and Choctaw nations from their ancestral homelands in the Southeastern United States to newly designated Indian Territory, west of the Mississippi River after the passage of the Indian Removal Act in 1830. The Cherokee removal in 1838 was the last forced removal east of the Mississippi and was brought on by the discovery of gold near Dahlonega, Georgia in 1828. The relocated peoples suffered from exposure, disease, and starvation while en route to their newly designated Indian reserve. Thousands died from disease before reaching their destinations or shortly after.

In 1811 George C. Sibley's expedition was guided from Fort Osage, Missouri to the Great Salt Plains by a local Osage Indian. Sibley and his followers are said to be the first white men to visit the plains, which they would later name the **Grand Saline**. From that day, settlers from Texas, Kansas, and the Indian nations made trips to the plains to extract the salt.

The saline was a very important geographical landmark, animals flocked to the area for the salt, making for excellent hunting. It became apparent that any tribe that controlled the Salt Plains would have to contend with intrusions by other tribes. Fierce battles raged over the use of this valuable resource.

We would like to thank Mr. Joe Crosby for historical research and background regarding John Ross and the Cherokee Nation.

I had gone on shore and heard the cry that the boat was sinking. I ran back into the cabin and picked up cousin Jane's baby and told them all to follow me. We got off just in time before the boat put off for a bar opposite. She gained it with much difficulty and sank immediately above the lower deck. The "Franklin" was waiting alongside and I had the utmost difficulty in getting my trunk and a few band boxes on board. I am really thankful that it is no worse.






John Howard Nichols was born in 1838, in Kingston, New Hampshire, and grew up in Exeter, New Hampshire, where he attended Phillips Academy. After graduation, he taught at a school in Stratham, New Hampshire for a year, before moving to Boston to work as a clerk for a tea importing house on Central Wharf. It was there that Nichols was noticed by John L. Gardner, who hired him as a supercargo on the bark "Arthur", which was bound for China in 1858. Once he arrived in China, Gardner requested that Nichols remain in China to act as an agent. He accepted the position and remained in China for ten years, returning to America once during this time.

The "Hartford" was Admiral Farragut's flagship during the Civil War. In later years it patrolled in the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans.

In 1882, as Captain Stephen B. Luce's flagship of the North Atlantic Station, "Hartford" visited the Caroline Island, Hawaii, and Valparaíso, Chile, before arriving San Francisco on 17 March 1884. Fred Gregory lists this as only one strike recorded, however we are aware of this cover and one other. A similar cover with this marking was sold in our Sale #26 (April 2007, Lot 2506) for \$3,500.

The 713-ton steam tugboat "U.S.S. Iroquois" arrived from San Francisco on January 28, 1899, and was stationed in Honolulu until May 19, 1900, with the exception of two documented voyages. The first was from August 13 to 15, 1899, when it traveled to Kauai to bring survivors of a shipwreck to Honolulu. The second was from February 13 to 16, 1900, to Hilo to investigate a report of plague. After May 1900, the "Iroquois" remained in Honolulu until sometime after Hawaii became a U.S. Territory.

The "Jamestown" had a long and storied history serving literally around the world. First off the coast of Africa in 1845 to suppress the slave trade, later in 1847 to assist the starving population in Ireland during the potato famine, as well as service during the Civil War, and later in Alaska. The "Jamestown" was present at the hoisting of the U.S. Flag at Sitka on 18 October 1867 after Alaska was purchased from Russia.

She was then fitted out as an apprentice training ship and in 1882 proceeded to the Atlantic coast via Cape Horn. In her new capacity, she sailed the Atlantic Ocean, voyaging to the West Indies, Spain, and as far north as the State of Maine.

The "S.S. Jeanie" was a large 1,071-ton, 186-foot, three-masted steam schooner built in Bath, Maine, in 1883, and had run on nearly every route between San Francisco and the Arctic Ocean. In 1906, the vessel, owned by the Alaska Coast Company, was engaged in hauling passengers and freight between Puget Sound ports and southwest Alaska.

On Sunday, November 18, 1906, the "S.S. Jeanie" collided with the inland passenger steamer "S.S. Dix" in the Puget Sound. The "Dix", traveling from downtown Seattle to Port Blakely on Bainbridge Island with 77 passengers and crew on board, sinks within five minutes with a loss of at least 39 lives. It is the greatest maritime disaster ever recorded on Puget Sound.

The "S.S. Jeanie" met her own fate on December 19, 1913, while en route from Seattle to southwestern Alaska. She ran aground in heavy fog on Calvert Island in Queen Charlotte Sound, British Columbia, and became a total loss. Fortunately, there were no lives lost. The crew was rescued by the Canadian steamship "S.S. Estevan".

The "Milo" (398 tons) was built at Newburyport, Massachusetts in 1811 for David Hinckley of Boston. This was a very fast vessel, capable of a transatlantic crossing in less than 20 days. In 1869, the "U.S.S Mohican" carried an astronomical surveying party through Bering Strait into the arctic. This letter was written in Iliuliuk (Bay), Unalaska which is located off Unalaska Island in the Aleutian Islands off mainland Alaska. On October 18, 1867, the United States purchased Alaska, which made Unalaska part of the U.S. territory.

The Aleut (Unangan) people have lived on Unalaska Island for thousands of years. The Unangan, who were the first to inhabit the island of Unalaska, named it "Ounalashka", meaning "near the peninsula".





MILGRAM BOOK AND SUPPLEMENT NUMBERING

The numbers in this catalog, M-1, M-2, M-3 etc., are taken from the book *Vessel-named Markings on United States Inland and Ocean Waterways 1810-1890* written by Dr. Milgram with the collaboration of 9 other persons and published by The Collectors Club of Chicago in 1984.

This book is still obtainable from the club if you contact them (<u>www.collectorsclubofchicago.org</u>). Two Supplements were written by Dr. Milgram and published in issues of The Postal History Journal with extension of the listings from 1784 to 1899. These listings bear the numbers **M1A**, **M2A or B etc**. Since it is felt that the majority of those reading this catalog do not have access to that journal, it was decided to make a listing of the numbers in the Supplements and also any additional numbers for newer listings not in either Supplement and print it here.
